- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

ADOPTED BY GOD

With the Incarnation of Christ our God, the humanity is saved from sin and death. With the presence of Christ in the world, every person in all places receive the Grace of the Holy Spirit, through Whom every individual has at his or her disposal the power of prayer from which miracles occur to the glory of God. In addition, each individual is enlightened with the Wisdom of Almighty God and, in turn, he or she is in the position to be *like* God in terms of making works of

divine love a reality.

Prior to the Incarnation of Christ, only chosen personalities—the Prophets of the Old Testament—had the power to perform miracles and to share God's Wisdom and Love with others. After the Incarnation of Christ, everyone in all places and at all times are, through prayer, given these gifts by the Holy Spirit.

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THE MISSION OF CHRIST IN OUR WORLD

Metropolitan Kallistos Ware, in his book, *The Orthodox Church*, writes the following:

"The Incarnation is an act of God's *philanthropia*, of His loving-kindness toward humankind. Several eastern writers, looking at the Incarnation from this point of view, have argued that even if humans had never fallen, God in His love for humanity would still have become human: the Incarnation must be seen as part of the eternal purpose of God, and not simply as an answer to the fall. Such was the view of Maximus the Confessor and of Isaac the Syrian; such has also been the view of certain western writers, most notably Duns Scotus (1265-1308).

"But because the human race fell, the Incarnation is not only an act of love, but an act of salvation. Jesus Christ, by uniting humankind and God in His own person, re-opened for us humans the path to *union* with God." (pg. 225). +FR. THEODORE

Με την Ενσάρκωσην του Θεού μας Χριστού, η ανθρώποτης σώζεται από την αμαρτίαν και τον θάνατον. Με την παρουσίαν του Χριστού στον κόσμον, όλοι οι άνθρωποι σε όλα τα μέρη λαμβάνουν την χάρην του Αγίου Πνεύματος διά μέσου του Οποίου όλοι έχουν στην διάθεσήν των την δύναμην της προσευχής από την οποίαν γίνονται θαύματα προς δόξαν του Θεού. Επίσης, φωτίζεται ο οποιοσδήποτε άνθρωπος με την σοφίαν του Παντοδυνάμου και, συνεπώς, είναι σε θέση να παρομοιασθεί με τον Θεόν κατά τις ικανότητές Του να πραγματοποιήσει έργα Θεϊκής αγάπης.

Πριν την Γέννησην του Χριστού, μόνον επιλεγμένοι άνθρωποι - οι Προφήτες της Παλαιάς Διαθήκηςείχαν την δύναμην να κάνουν θαύματα και να μοιρασθούν την σοφίαν και την αγάπην του Θεού με άλλους. Μετά την Γέννησην του Χριστού, όλοι οι άνθρωποι σε όλα τα μέρη και ανά πάσα στιγμή δίδονται από το Άγιο Πνεύμα, διά μέσου της προσευχής, αυτά τα θεία χαρίσματα. Δηλαδή, ο άνθρωπος, μετά την Ενσάρκωση του Χριστού μπορεί με την χάρη του Αγίου Πνεύματος να θεοποιηθεί – κάτι που, πριν την Γέννησην του Χριστού, δεν ήταν δυνατόν στον άνθρωπον.

Οι ηθικές και πνευματικές διδασ-καλίες της Εκκλησίας βασίζονται στην πίστην ότι ο Θεός, διά μέσου της Ενσαρκώσεώς Του, υιοθέτησε τον άνθρωπον. Δεν είμεθα πλέον <πλάσματα> του Θεού – είμεθα τέκνα του Θεού προικισμένοι με Θεϊκές δυνάμεις.

themselves the powers of God's love (that is, to become deified), "by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God the Father and the communion of the Holy Spirit," as we hear during the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. We are no longer simply created beings, but we are children of God -- inheritors of God's divine love and energy.

It is in our participation in the Holy Sacraments that this inheritance of the divine love and energies of God can be visibly seen. Let us keep in mind that the Holy Sacraments themselves are actually a style of life consistent with the *meaning* of the Sacramental prayers. It is in this regard that the very countenances of individuals so often change, becoming those of a divine radiance, which is often visibly seen.

For example, when speaking about the Sacrament of Holy Confession, the saintly Elder Paisios, noted: "When one confesses his or her sins in a heart-felt, sincere manner, everything from the past disappears. New sources of nourishment are opened...the Grace of God comes upon them and people change completely. Anxiety, uneasiness, anger are gone and gentleness and peace appear. This is noticeable, even in one's external features - so much so, that I tell some people to take "before" and "after" pictures surrounding their experience in Holy Confession so that even they can be convinced of their great change for the better, since in their faces one sees their inner spiritual nature." (The Power of Confession; Anthology of Teachings From Sts. Porphyrios and Paisios, for the Paper, Paraskinion, Greek Edition, pg. 31).

This "glow" is the Light of God within us - that part of our being that is of Christ, Who, being God, took our human flesh from the Ever-Virgin Mary by the Holy Spirit. In turn, living our lives to glorify God brings our flesh more and more in touch with God's Divinity. This is what Orthodox Christian Saints call *deification*. This Christmas, then, is our opportunity to start imitating Christ and His Saints, becoming ever more *human...in God's divinity*.

<u>Sunday Resurrection Hymn</u>: Ton synanarchon Logon [Tone 5]...(Let us, the faithful, praise and worship the Word, coeternal with the Father and the Spirit, Who for our salvation was born of a Virgin for He willed to be lifted up bodily upon the Cross, to endure death and to raise the dead by His glorious Resurrection.)

Hymn for the Eve of the Nativity: Etimazou Vithlehem... (O Bethlehem, prepare, Eden is opened to all. And be ready Ephrata, for the Tree of life has in the grotto blossomed forth from the Virgin. Indeed, Her womb is shwn to be spiritually a paradise in which is found the God-planted Tree. And if we eat from it, we shall live, and shall not die as did Adam of old. Christ is born so that He might raise up the formerly fallen image.)

<u>Hymn for the Holy Fathers</u>:Meghala ta tis pisteos katorthoh-mata... (Magnificent are Faith's accomplishments! The Three Holy Youths exultingly stood in the fountain of fire as if beside the still waters of rest. And Daniel the Prophet was shown to be a shepherd of lions. At their entreaty, O Christ God, save our souls.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis...(As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of Kings, bearer of trophies are you O Great Martyr George. Intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday</u>: Ee Parthenos Simeron ...(On this day the Virgin Maid goes to the grotto to give birth to the pre-eternal Word in an ineffable manner. Dance for joy, all the inhabited earth, on hearing. Glorify along with Angels and with the shepherds Him who willed that He appear as a newborn Child, the pre-eternal God.)
