#### Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiv-ing.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

#### THE AUTHORITY OF CHRIST

From today's passage from St. Luke's Gospel, we come to know about two of Christ's miracles: 1) the cure of the woman suffering from a hemorrhage, and, 2) the resurrection from the dead of Jairus' daughter. By virtue of these two miracles, we understand that Christ is True God, Who has authority in all of creation. The Church emphasizes this in Her funeral prayers, in these words: "O God of all spirits and of all flesh, Who trampled down death and destroyed the devil, giving

#### life to Your world..."

Last Sunday, we saw that Christ is the God "over all spirits." Dark spirits "obey" Christ out of fear, because they know that He has the authority to destroy them. It is a kind of obedience which of "the laws of nature," by which every thing "obeys" in relation to the energies of the other things which exist all around it. The obedience to God by the Saints is obedience based on love for God. The fear of God from the point of

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#### **THE CELEBRATION OF THE "DAY OF '<u>NO</u>'" -- IN GREEK: "OXI!"** The **Protection of the Mother of God** is a Feast day of the Church celebrating the appearance of the Mother of God at Blachernae (Vlaherna) in the tenth century. At the end of his life, St. Andrew of Constantinople (of Russian descent), with his disciple St. Epiphanius, along with a group of people, saw the Mother of God, St. John the Baptist, and several other saints and angels during a vigil in the Church of Blachernae. The Blachernae Palace church was where

several of Her relics were kept. These relics were Her robe, veil, and part of Her belt that had been transferred from Palestine during the fifth century. Following Her appearance, barbarian forces threatening this city were mysteriously scattered, no longer posing a threat.

In recent years, the Feast of the Protection is celebrated in thanksgiving for the deliverance of the Greek nation from the Italian invasion of 1940. These events are commemorated in Greece in a national holiday known as "Ochi Day" or "No Day," referring to the response of the Greek leader Metaxas to Musso-lini's ultimatum. In recognition of this, and because of the many miracles of the Holy Virgin which were reported by Greek soldiers during the Greco-Italian War of 1940-1941,the Holy Synod of the Church of Greece elected in 1952 to observe the Feast day on <u>October 28</u>. The observance includes the chanting of a Doxology incorporating hymns recognizing the Protection of the Theotokos over the faithful, as well as the kontakion "<u>Champion Leader</u>." *–-Taken from: <u>www.orthodoxwiki.org</u>*

Ειναι ενα ειδος υπακοης <των νομων της φυσεως,> συμφωνα με τους οποιους καθε πραγμα <υπακουεται> στις <ενεργιες> των αλλων πραγματων που υπαρχουν ολο γυνω. Η υπακουη των Αγιων προς τον Θεον ειναι ειδος υπακοης βασισμενη στην αγαπη για τον Θεον. Ο φοβος του Θεου απο την αποψην των Αγιων ειναι φοβος που στηριζεται απο την αγαπην και, εν τουτοις, δειχνεται δια μεσου της ταπεινοφροσυνης. Ο φοβος του πιστου Χριστιανου εκφραζεται στα λογια μιας ευχης της Θ. Λειτουργιας: <Εν ταις λαμπροτησι των Αγιων Σου, πως εισελευσομαι ο αναξιος; Εαν γαρ τολμησω συνεισελθειν εις τον νυμφωνα, ο χιτων με ελεγχει,...Καθαρισον, Κυρε, τον ρυπον της ψυχης μου και σωσον με, ως φιλανθρωπος.>Δια της ευχης αυτης, εκφραζουμεν τον <σεβασμιον φοβον> της ταπεινοφροσυνης, που συνδεεται με την αρετην της αγαπης. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

of view of the Saints is a fear *in humility* supported by love. This "humble fear," is expressed the "Communion Prayer:" "Into the brightness of Your Saints, how can I who am unworthy enter? If I dare to enter the bridal chamber, my garment will accuse me, for it is not a fitting wedding garment...Cleanse me, Lord, from the filth of my soul and save me, O Merciful One." This prayer reflects the "humble fear" which is tied to love and which allows our Lord to heal the body and soul.

In today's Gospel, we note that both the woman suffering a hemorrhage and Jairus approached Christ with the attitude shared in this the prayers of the Divine Liturgy. In both cases, great respect in humility can be seen -- the "fear" and "trembling" that surrounded the cure of the woman and the raising of Jairus' daughter from the dead are associated with the acknowledgement of Christ's authority over "all spirits and flesh" and over the *living* and the *dead* -- over the living, shown by the cure of the woman; over the dead, shown by the raising of Jairus' daughter. Realizing God's powers actually does make us humble. The obedience to God's Will that comes from such humility gives way to the virtue of love and the value of having a purpose in life.

Manifesting God's love *is* our purpose, because through God's love, we save ourselves and others. No one embodies this message more than the Mother of God. Today we commemorate the Feast of the Protection of the Holy Mother of God, remembering that under Her Protection both Russia and Greece. Her Protection is seen through historic experiences, which have occurred through which the faithful of the Orthodox Church have been protected from deceptions, danger and destruction. The icon of the Platytera, which is positioned in nearly all Orthodox church edifices high behind the Holy Altar points to Her role in our salvation. The word "Platytera" means, "*more spacious than the heavens;*" for, indeed, the Mother of God brought into the world Christ God, the Creator of the universe and She presents Him to us as the Only Savior -- and Protector -- of our lives.

In Her humanity, She brings God's divinity to us so that in *our* humanity, we can be one with *God's* divinity. Her purpose is *our* purpose, and, as such, it is the very purpose of the Church. It makes sense, then, that Her image holding the Creator of the universe, Who has authority over all spirits and every flesh, as well as over the living and the dead, stands above the Altar, drawing us to Holy Communion so that, like Her, we can bring Christ into the world to bring healing and resurrection to all.

ANTIPHON I : "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...)

<u>Verse 1</u>—Bless the Lord O my soul and everything within me; Bless His Holy Name. *Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."* 

<u>Verse 2-</u>Bless the Lord O my soul and forget not all His rewards. *Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."* 

<u>Verse 3 –</u> The Lord prepared His throne in heaven and His Kingdom rules over all. *Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."* 

Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> Praise the Lord O my soul! I shall praise the Lord while I live; I shall sing to my God as long as I exist.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Verse 2</u> –Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob; his hope is in the Lord his God. *Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who arose from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia."* 

<u>Verse 3 -</u> The Lord shall reign forever; your God O Zion, to all generations. *Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."* 

Doxa Patri ke Io ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous eonas ton eonon. Amin People: "O Monogenis Ios ke Logos tou Theou..." (O Only-Begotten Son and Word of God...)

ANTIPHON III This is the day the Lord has made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

<u>Sunday Resurrection Hymn</u>: Ton synanarchon logon (Tone 5)... (Let us, the faithful, praise and worship the Word, coeternal with the Father and the Spirit, Who for our salvation was born of a Virgin for He willed to be lifted up bodily upon the Cross, to endure death and to raise the dead by His glorious Resurrection.)

<u>Hymn for the Feast of the Protection</u>: Tis Skepis Sou Parthena... (We sing the praise of the graces of your Protecting Veil, O Virgin, which like a light-bearing cloud you unfold beyond understanding, and you spiritually protect your people from every assault of their foe. For we have gained you as Protection and defender and helper, as we cry out to you: Glory to your mighty deeds, O Pure one; glory to your Protection; glory to your providence towards us, O Immaculate!)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis...(*Since you are a deliverer of captives and a defender of the poor; a physician for the sick and a noble attendant to kings, O Great among the Martyrs and Glorious George: intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.*)

<u>Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday</u>: Prostasia ton Christianon ...(A Protection of Christians unshamable, Intercessor to our Holy Maker, unwavering, reject not the prayerful cries of those who are in sin. Instead, come to us for You are good; Your loving help bring to us, who are crying in faith to You: Hasten now to intercede and speed now to supplicate, as a Protection for all time, O Theotokos, for those who honor You.)



All pets must be on leash and supervised. Please join us! **RSVP by Oct. 30th to:** pdsaintgeorge@gmail.com


