THE BAPTISM OF CHRIST OUR GOD IN THE JORDAN- HOLY THEOPHANY

#### **FULFILLING RIGHTEOUSNESS**

At the moment when Christ drew near to St. John the Baptist in order to be baptized in the River Jordan, in answer to St. John's concern, "I have need to be baptized of You...", our Savior said: "Let it be so now, to fulfill all righteousness." (St. Matthew 3:14-15).

St. John Chrysostom explains that our Lord was not baptized in order to be washed from sins, because our Lord is without any sin. In addition, our Lord was not baptized as an act of repentance, because He is God and has no need to repent of any sin, nor to be saved. Finally, our Lord was not baptized in order to be born again "by water and Spirit," because, (once again) Christ is Himself Perfect God and Perfect Man.

According to St. John Chrysostom, our Savior was Baptized in the Jordan to be revealed as God Who is our Savior, as One of the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) and also to fulfill God's righteousness.

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# Holy Communion Order

Deacon Euthym Kontaxis,

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

#### HOLY WATER ON THE FEAST DAY OF THEOPHANY

Orthodox Christians most often bless themselves with holy water by drinking it. It is traditional to keep a quantity of it at home, and many Orthodox Christians will drink a small amount daily with their morning prayers. It is also often taken with prayer in times of distress or temptation. The use of holy water is based on the Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the River Jordan, and the Orthodox interpretation of this event. In their view, John's baptism was a baptism of repentance, and the people came to have their sins washed away by the water. Since Jesus had no sin, but was God incarnate, his baptism had the effect not of washing away Jesus' sins, but of blessing the water, making it holy—and with it all of creation, so that it may be used fully for its original created purpose to be an instrument of life.

On the Great Feast of Theophany, holy water is blessed twice: at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy on the eve of the feast, and on morning of the feast itself. After proceeding to the place where the vessel of water is prepared to the singing of appropriate troparia (hymns) of the Theophany there are a group of Scripture readings (Isaiah 35:1-10; 55:1-13;12:3-6) and 1 Corinthians 10:1-4, culminating in the baptism account from the Gospel of Saint Mark (1:9-11).

Την στιγμήν που ο Χριστός έφτασε κοντά στον Άγιον Ιωάννην τον Βαπτιστήν γιά να βαπτισθεί στον Ιορδάνη, απαντώντας στην απορίαν του Αγίου Ιωάννου, «Εγώ χρείαν έχω ὑπό Σου βαπτισθήναι, και Συ έρχη προς με;» ο Χριστός είπε, «Αφες άρτι, ούτω γαρ πρέπον εστίν ημίν πληρώσαι πάσαν δικαιοσύνην.» (Μαθ. 3: 14–15).

Ο Αγιος Ιωάννης ο Χρυσόστομος εξηγεί ότι ο Κύριος μας δεν εβαπτισθηκε γιά να πλυθεί από τις αμαρτίες, διότι ο Κύριος δεν έχει καθόλου αμαρτίες. Επιλέον, ο Κύριος δεν εβαπτίσθηκε ως πράξη μετανοίας, επειδή δεν χρειάζεται να μετανοήσει για αμαρτίες προς σωτηρίαν. Τέλος, ο Κύριος μας δεν εβαπτίσθηκε <διά ύδατος και Πνεύματος,> επειδή ο Χριστός είναι ο Ίδιος Τέλειος Θεός και Τέλειος Άνθρωπος.

Ο Άγιος Χρυσόστομος έλεγε ότι ο Χριστός εβαπτίσθηκε στον Ιορδά-νην γιά να αποκαλυφθεί ως Θεός, ο Σωτήρ του κόσμου – ο Ένας Θεός σε τρία Πρόσωπα: ο Πατήρ, ο Υιός και το Άγιο Πνεύμα. Επίσης εβαπτίσθηκε γιά να εκπληρώσει την δικαιοσύνην του Θεού.

Η εκπλήρωση του Θείου Νόμου επιτυγχάνεται μόνον δια μέσου της υπακοής στον Θεόν. Στο Βάπτισμα του Χριστού του Θεού, βλέπουμεν ότι Αυτός εκπληρώνει τον Νόμον διά μέσου της δικής Του υπακοής στον ίδιον το Νόμον που μας δίνει.

Ας εορτάσουμεν εφέτος τα Φώτα υποσχεθώντας την προσωπικήν υπακοήν στον Θεόν.

This revelation of God as the Holy Trinity, is why the Baptism of our Savior is also called *Theophany*. The Baptism of Christ our God also reveals that fulfillment of the Divine Law is accomplished only through obedience to God. In the Baptism of Christ our God, we see that He fulfills the Law through His own obedience to the very Law that He gives us. St. John Chrysostom tell us: "Fulfilling this righteousness was necessary for all people – but no one of them kept it or fulfilled it - Christ came then and fulfilled this righteousness...As Christ was circumcised, offered sacrifice, kept the Sabbath and observed the Jewish feasts, so also He added this remaining thing, that He was obedient to having been baptized by a prophet. It was the will of God, then, that all should be baptized – about which John speaks: "He having sent me to baptize with water" (John 1:33)...Thus, if obedience to God constitutes righteousness, and God sent John to baptize the nation, then Christ has also fulfilled this along with all the other commandments." (Discourse on the Day of the Baptism of Christ, by St. John Chrysostom: Taken from Orthodox Church in America, https://oca.org/fs/sermons)

If obedience to God's Law and Will is so treasured that God sacrificed Himself to undo our disobedience, think how important is it for *us* to obey God's Word at all times! God's Word is our salvation!

Obedience to God is the cornerstone of marriages and the raising of children, because it is the only way to show gratitude to God and others who love us - and it is through *obedience to God* that we are given the grace of the Holy Spirit. This helps, only in part, to explain the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Christ at His Baptism, by which we are reconciled with God. "Wherefore also the Spirit descended as a dove, because where there is reconciliation with God – there also is the dove. So also in the ark of Noah the dove brought the branch of olive – a sign of God's love of mankind...." (Discourse on the Day of the Baptism of Christ, by St. John Chrysostom, taken from Orthodox Church in America, https://oca.org/fs/sermons).

Let us celebrate this year's Feast of the Theophany by partaking of the Waters, which are given to us today through the grace of the Holy Spirit as the Waters of our Savior's Baptism, remembering that all we can do to show thanksgiving to Christ our God is to be obedient to His Word given to us in Holy Scripture.

ANTIPHON I: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...)

<u>Verse 1—</u>: In the exodus of Israel from Egypt, the house of Jacob. Judah became His sanctuary.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

**Verse 2-** The sea saw them and fled, the Jordan turned back.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

<u>Verse 3—</u> What is it to you, O Sea, that you fled, and to you, O Jordan, that you turned back?

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit now and forever and to the ages of ages.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> I have loved, because the Lord shall hear the voice of my supplication.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O en Iordhani ipo Iannou vaptistheis, psallontas si alleluia."

Verse 2 - For He inclined His ear to me, and in my days I shall call upon Him.

Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who was baptized in the Jordan by John, we sing to You, Alleluia."

<u>Verse 3 -</u> The pains of death surrounded me; the dangers of Hades found me. The Lord is merciful and righteous, and our God has mercy.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O en Iordhani ipo Ioannou vaptistheis, psallontas si alleluia."

Doxa Patri ke Io ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous eonas ton eonon. Amin People: "O Monogenis Ios ke Logos tou Theou..." (O Only-Begotten Son and Word of God...)

ANTIPHON III: Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; for His mercy endures forever. Let the house of Israel say that He is good, for His mercy endures forever. Let all who fear the Lord say that He is good, for His mercy endures forever.

Entrance with the Holy Gospel: (Priest & Deacon): Evloghimenos o Erhowmenos....(Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. God is the Lord, and He revealed Himself to us Save us, O Son of God, who were baptized in the Jordan by John.)

<u>Hymn for Theophany</u>: En Iordani Vaptizomenou Sou Kyrie... (At Your Baptism in the Jordan River, O Christ, the worship due to the Holy Trinity was made manifest, for the voice of the Father bore You witness by calling You 'Beloved Son', and the Holy Spirit, in the form of a Dove, confirmed the immutability of this declaration. O Christ God Who appeared and illumined the world, glory to You.)

Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday: Epefanis simeron ti oikoumeni... (You have appeared today to the world and Your light, O Lord, has been shown upon us. With full knowledge we praise You. You have come; You are manifested, O unapproachable Light.)

Instead of "Aghios o Theos (Holy God, Holy Mighty...) the following is sung: "Osi eis Christon evaptistiteh, Christon enedhisastheh"...(All who have been baptized in Christ have put on Christ. Alleluia).

READINGS: EPISTLE - Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7 / GOSPEL - St. Matthew 3: 13-17

The Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great is celebrated today. Following the reading of the Creed, turn to page 126 in the Divine Liturgy books.

Instead of "Axion Estin," the Hymn "Epi Si Cheree" is sung.

<u>Communion Hymn</u>: Epefani ee Chahrhis tou Theou - ee Sotirios pasin anthropeis. (*The Grace of God has appeared for the salvation of all. Alleluia.*)

"Again we pray for mercy, life, health, peace, forgiveness and salvation for the servants of God..." cutting out a piece of Vasilopita for our Lord, the Theotokos, St. George, our Patriarch, Archbishop, Metropolitan, fellow clergy and the leaders of each parish organization, concluding with the Dismissal Prayers found on page 80 of our Divine Liturgy Books.
