Holy Communion Order

- 1. Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiv-ing.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

SHE IS THE CHURCH

It might be said that the Myrrh-bearing Women provide a vision, in part, of the ministry of the Orthodox Christian Church. It may not be a coincidence at all that the Church is referred to in the Greek Language in the feminine gender as <u>n Εκκλησια</u>, pronounced: "ee ecclesee-a." After all, the work of glorifying the Crucified and Risen Christ God was first performed by these Myrrh-bearing Women, risking life and limb to offer myrrh oils to Christ in the tomb. While the Apostles themselves were hiding due to their fear of persecution, these

Women were ministering to Christ at His tomb.

The tomb of Christ itself is a type for the "church building" where the faithful worship Him. The tomb is called a "bridal chamber" from where Christ came forth as the Victor over death. By extension, our church as a "place of worship" is Christ's "bridal chamber" from where we who bear Christ in our souls burst forth with the message to all people of His everlasting life, as we continue to chant aloud the Good News, "Christ is Risen!" *Continued on page 2*

LESSONS FROM THE MYRRH-BEARING WOMEN

The dedication to responsibility on the part of the Myrrh-bearing Women to anoint the Body of Christ, following His death on the Cross, is an example of living, dynamic prayer. Such living, dynamic prayer includes all the elements of the soul and entire personality – our motives; our ideology; our thoughts; our mentality; our hopes and our dreams. What motivated them to do so was deep inside their souls - i.e., their love for Christ; their belief that He is God; their sense of responsibility toward what is proper. This love and belief, as well as the sense of responsibility, transcends all obstacles - represented figuratively by the "large stone" that covered our Lord's tomb and the "fear of the Pharisees." The Myrrh-bearers, like all the Saints after them, challenge us to push ourselves ever more in the advancement of our spiritual life and in our giving of time, talent and treasure to others and to the work of our Lord's Church. In honor of the Myrrh-bearing Women, whom we commemorate today, we are all called to anoint His Sacred Body - His Churchwith our prayers and good deeds today through our love in Christ for one another.

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Μπορεί να ειπωθεί ότι οι Μυροφόρες παρέγουν ένα όραμα, εν μέρει, περί το έργον της Εκκλησίας μας. Μπορεί να μην είναι σύμπτωσις καθόλου ότι η Εκκλησία αναφερέται στο θηλυκό φύλο. Μετά από όλα, το έργο της δοξασίας του Εσταυρωμένου και Αναστημένου Χριστού εκτελέσθηκε γιά πρώτη φορά από τις Μυροφόρες Γυναίκες, διακινδυνεύοντας την ζωήν των γιά να προσφέρουν μύρο στον Ενταφιασμένον Χριστόν. Ενώ οι Απόστολοι εκρυβόνταν εξαιτίας του φόβου των από τους εχθούς του Χριστού, αυτές υπηρετούσαν τον Χριστόν στον τάφο Του.

Ο τάφος του Ιδίου Χριστού είναι ένας <τύπος> γιά τον ναόν της Εκκλησίας, όπου οι πιστοί Τον λατρεύουν. Ο τάφος ονομάζεται <νυφικό θάλαμο> από όπου βγήκε ο Χριστός ως Νικητής του θανά– του. Ως εκ τούτου, ο ναός της Εκ– κλησίας, ως τόπος λατρείας, είναι <νυφικό θάλαμο >του Χριστού από όπου και εμείς οι Χριστο– φόροι πορεύουμεν στον κόσμον διακηρύσσοντας: Χριστός Ανέστη!

Η Θεοτόκος είναι μιά από τις Μυροφόρες – μία από τις μάρ– τυρες της Αναστάσεως, δεδομένου ότι τεκνοποίησε τον Χριστόν ἐν σαρκί. Η παρουσία Της στον τάφο εκπληρώνει τον σκοπόν της ζωής Της. Αυτή είναι η Πηγή της σω– τηρίας της ανθρωπότητος, όπως είναι και ο τάφος του Χριστού.

Στην εκτέλεσην της Αρτοκλασίας ακούμεν: <Εὐλογημένη Σύ ἐν γυναιξί ὅτι Σωτήρα ἕτεκες τῶν ψυχῶν ἡμῶν.>Στην Προσκομηδήν, ὁ ιερεύς διαβάζει την ευχήν: <Ως ζωηφόρος, ὡς Παραδείσου ὡραιότερος, Χριστέ ὁ τάφος Σοῦ, ἡ Πηγή τῆς ἡμῶν Ἀναστάσεως.> +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

The standard iconography of our Church, with the Platytera (i.e., the icon of the Ever-Virgin Mary with Christ), set in the apse of the church temple, behind the Altar Table, expresses the full nature of Her role in our salvation. By extension, Her role is amplified in Her presence with the other Myrrh-bearing Women, who approached the tomb of Christ and were blessed to be the first to witness His Resurrection. During the Service of the Blessing of the Five Loaves, these words are attributed to the Ever-Virgin Mary: "Blessed are You among women and blessed is the fruit of Your womb." To the extreme, the "fruit" of Her womb is the Church - the Body of Christ. At the same time, Her presence at the tomb of our Lord fulfills Her birthgiving role for our salvation. For, in preparation for the celebration of the Divine Liturgy, the tomb of Christ is called the "birth place" of our Resurrection with Him, as these words are intoned by the Priest: "As life-bearing, more beautiful than Paradise, indeed more brilliant than any royal chamber, was Your tomb, O Christ, the fountainhead of our resurrection."

Hence, the Church is referred to in the feminine gender. For, Her mission is to make us all myrrh-bearers, giving the myrrh of the Divine Love to everyone around us. Vladimir Lossky notes how the Ever-Virgin Mary works into the Orthodox Christian understanding of the life and mission of Christ's Holy Church. In essence, She represents everything that each of us is destined to become as brothers and sisters of Christ, having participated in His death and Resurrection through Holy Baptism. "Only the Mother of God (the first among the Myrrh-bearers), through Whom the Word was made flesh, is able to receive the plentitude of grace and to attain unlimited glory, by realizing in Her Person all the holiness of which the Church is capable...It is only through our experience of life in the Church that we can adhere to the unlimited devotion which the Church offers to the Mother of God; and the degree of our adherence to this devotion will be the measure of the extent to which we belong to the Body of Christ (i.e., His Church). (In the Image and Likeness of God, pgs. 207 & 210).

As we celebrate Mother's Day today, let us give honor to the Mother of God, our Savior. She goes beyond the priceless role of every woman as being a "human bridge," taking us from our nonexistence to life itself. The Ever-Virgin Mary is the "Human Bridge" that takes us from earth to Heaven, leading us, as She led the Myrrh-bearing Women, to the Resurrection of Christ. +FR. THEODORE HYMNS FOR THIS SUNDAY'S CELEBRATION OF THE DIVINE LITURGY:

ANTIPHON I : "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...) <u>Verse 1</u>—Shout to God, all the earth. Sing now to His name; give glory to His praise. Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

<u>Verse 2 – Say to God</u>, "How fearful are Your works." *Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."*

<u>Verse 3 – Let all the earth worship You and sing to You.</u> *Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."*

Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse -1 – May God be gracious to us, and bless us. May He cause His face to shine upon us, and have mer</u> cy on us.

Refrain: "Soson imas Yie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas Si, alleluia."

<u>Verse 2</u>—That we may know His way on the earth, Your salvation among all the Gentiles. *Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who arose from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia."*

<u>Verse 3 – Let the peoples give thanks to You, O God; let all the peoples praise You.</u> *Refrain: "Soson imas Yie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas Si, alleluia."*

<u>Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.</u> People: "O Monogenis Ios ke Logos tou Theou..." (O Only-Begotten Son and Word of God...)

ANTIPHON III: Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered, and let those who hate Him flee from before His face. As smoke vanishes, so let them vanish, as wax melts before the fire. So shall the sinners perish from the face of God. And let the righteous be glad. This is the day the Lord made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

<u>Sunday Resurrection Hymn</u>: Christos Anesti... (Christ is Risen from the dead; O Christ is Risen from the dead, trampling down death by death and to those in the tombs bestowing life.)

<u>Second Resurrection Hymn</u>: Ote katilthes pros ton thanaton... (When You descended to the realm of death, You as Life Immortal rendered to Hades a mortal blow by Your all-radiant divinity. And when You from internal depths and the darkness below did raise the dead all the hosts of heaven's powers did proclaim and cry out: O Life-Giving Christ our God, we give glory.)

<u>Hymn for St. Joseph of Arimathea</u>: O efschimon Iosif apo tou xilou...(*The noble Joseph, taking Your Immaculate Body down from the Tree and having wrapped It in pure linen and spices, laid It for burial in a new tomb.* But on the third day You did arise, O Lord, granting great mercy to the world.)

<u>Hymn for the Myrrh-bearing Women</u>: Tes Myrofores ghinexee... (Unto the Myrrh-bearing Women did the Angel cry out as he stood by the grave: Myrrh-oils are meet for the dead, but Christ has proved to be a stranger to corruption. But cry out: The Lord is risen granting great mercy to the world.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis...(Since you are a deliverer of captives and a defender of the poor; a physician for the sick and a noble attendant to kings, O Great among the Martyrs and glorious George, intercede with Christ God that He will save our souls.)

<u>Kontakion Hymn</u>: Ei ke en tafo katilthes... (Though You did descend into the grave, O Immortal One, yet did You destroy the power of Hades and did arise, as Victor, O Christ God, calling to the Myrrh-bearing Women: 'Rejoice!' and giving peace to Your Apostles, O You Who does grant Resurrection to the fallen.)

READINGS – EPISTLE- Acts 6:1-7/GOSPEL- St. Mark 15: 43 - 16: 8

Instead of "Axion Estin," O Angelos evoh-a ti Keharitomeni...(The Angel cried aloud to the Lady full of grace: Rejoice, O pure Virgin; and again I say Rejoice. Your Son has truly risen from the grave on the third day. Be illumined, illumined, O New Jerusalem; for the glory of the Lord has arisen over you. Dance now for joy, O Zion, and exult. And you be merry, O pure Theotokos, at the arising of the One you bore.)

Communion Hymn: Soma Christou...(Receive the Body of Christ; taste from the immortal fount.)
