Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

THE TREASURE OF DIVINE LOVE

The Divine Liturgy is celebrated in order to change us into becoming saints. This is to be our purpose for which we attend worship. Thus, the priest intones before the Communion Hymn: "Holy Gifts for the holy people of God." Our "saintliness" is in the fact that our faith in Christ helps us overcome our own imperfections, as well as those of the world around us.

To the Galatians, St. Paul writes: "God forbid that I should boast except in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by Whom the

world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." (6:14). This indeed is the model for Orthodox sainthood in which coping with our own errors and the failings of the world around us, with God's grace, leads to overcoming the world. In fact, the ability to cope is a benchmark for the spiritual health needed to work toward sainthood.

Our abilities to deal with set-backs or illnesses is often sabotaged by our lack of patience and our lack of faith. In this way, we bring upon ourselves more pain and suffering. The illusion *Continued on page 2*

Counseling includes support for the care in raising their soon-to-be-born child, but also informs parents of options for adoption by families who will nurture the child as their own, giving him or her every opportunity to enjoy their right to live.

"Since the earliest days of Her existence, the Christian Church has consistently declared willful abortion of a human fetus to be equivalent to murder. St. Basil in the fourth century declared that, 'Those who give potions for the destruction of the child conceived in the womb are murderers; as are they who take the poisons to kill the child." (8th Canon Law of St. Basil)...That God Himself places ultimate value on the sanctity of human life is evident by the fact that out of His great love for us, 'He gave His Only-Begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16)...[Regarding the personhood of the fetus], we profess that no human being

is ever fully a 'person,' but that all persons have the potential to become 'fully human,' to achieve union with God. Therefore, we cannot declare on the basis of 'personhood' that the fetus in the womb has no value, or lesser value in the eyes of both God and man than a person born."

Η Θεία Λειτουργία εκτελείται με σκοπόν να μας κάνει αγίους. Αυτός πρέπει να είναι ο σκοπός μας γιά να εκκλησιαζώμεθα. Η <αγιότητά> μας εγκείται στο γεγονός ότι η πίστις μας στον Χριστόν μας βοηθά να αντιμετωπίσουμεν και να ξεπεράσουμεν τις δικές μας ατέλειες και τις ατέλειες του πεσμένου κόσμου.

Προς τους Γαλάτας ο Απ. Παύλος γράφει: <... Έν τῷ Σταθρῷ τοῦ Κυ-ρίου ἡμῶν Ἰησοῦ Χριστοῦ, δι' οὖ ὁ κόσμος ἐσταύρωται κὰγώ τῷ κόσμω.> (6:14). Αυτό είναι πράγματι το <μοντέλο> της Ορθόδοξης αγιοσύνης, στο οποίο η αντιμετώπιση των δικών μας αδυναμιών και των αδυναμιών του κόσμου γύρω μας, με την χάρην του Θεού, οδηγεί στην υπερνίκησην του κόσμου.

Στην πραγματικότηταν, η ικανότητα αντιμετωπίσεως είναι ένα μέτρον της πνευματικής υγείας, με την οποίαν κάνουμεν άσκησην προς την αγιότηταν. Η ψευδαίσθηση ότι ο πλούτος θα μας σώσει από δυσκολίες και θλήψεις υπονομεύει τις ικανότητές μας να τις αντιμετωπίσουμεν και να τις ξεπεράσουμεν.

Με ταπείνωσην προς τον Χριστόν, πρέπει να βάλουμεν στην ακρην τον εγωϊσμόν μας, κάνοντας κάθε δυνατή προσπάθειαν να <ανατρέ—ψουμεν> τις αμαρτίες μας με την εξομολόγησην και με την μετάνοι—αν, που απαιτεί από εμάς να αντιμετωπίζουμεν τις συνήθειες και τα σφάλματά μας που είναι αντίθετα με τις Εντολές του Θεού.

Με αυτόν τον τρόπον η ίδια η παρουσία μας στις ζωές των άλ-λων παίρνει μαγάλη αξία. Είναι, μάλιστα, μεγαλύτερη αξία από τα υλικά πλούτη του κόσμου επειδή συγκρίνεται με την παρουσίαν των Αγίων.

that wealth will rescue us from pain and suffering also sabotages our abilities to cope with and overcome them. To think that wealth will rescue us from death is certainly a fantasy.

We would be in denial if we thought that we do not commit sins, whether in our thoughts (jealousy, lust), our words (gossip, insults, lies), or our deeds (hatred, abuse). "To be crucified to the world" means that we put aside our pride by making every effort to "undo" our sins through confession and repentance, which requires that we grapple with habits or faults which are contrary to God's Commandments. This struggle requires our humility so as to seek spiritual advice from a priest or elder of the Church; from Scripture, and, if necessary from a professional Christian counselor. Ultimately, however, it is the grace of the Holy Spirit that is at work in us, if we are humble enough to allow it.

To be sure, material wealth is of little value compared to the vast treasure of our Savior's eternal blessings by which we become His co-workers in providing peace and wellbeing to others. In this way, our very presence in the lives of others takes on great *value*, equal in worth to that of the Saints. Even after their departure from this world, they lead us to Salvation in Christ by virtue of having struggled with their own imperfections. Their lives are of eternal worth, which is why during some feasts of the Church, the verse from Psalm 116 is chanted as a Communion Hymn: "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints."

Unfortunately, the rich man of today's Gospel defined the value of his life by his material wealth, rather than by his love for God.

While we should always be aware of our sins -- and repent of them -- let us not overlook those qualities in us that compare with the Saints. Our participation in the Sacraments today give testimony to the fact that we have saintly qualities that we must continue to nurture and never lose. In this, let us avoid boasting about ourselves, however. Let us boast about our Savior Jesus Christ, Who helps us to overcome the world, since, through the Cross, Christ conquered death itself.

<u>Verse 1—</u> Bless the Lord, O my soul, and everything within me, bless His holy name Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

Verse 2- Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His rewards.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas.

Verse 3- The Lord prepared His throne in heaven, and His Kingdom rules over all.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

Chanter(s): Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> Praise the Lord, O my soul! I shall praise the Lord while I live; I shall sing to my God as long as I exist. Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Verse 2 -</u> Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob; his hope is in the Lord his God.

Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who Arose from the dead; we sing to You, Alleluia."

<u>Verse 3 - </u> The Lord shall reign forever; your God, O Zion, to all generations.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Doxa Patri ke Yio ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous aonas ton aonon. Amin.</u> "O Monogenis Yios ke Logos tou Theou…"

ANTIPHON III- This is the day the Lord made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

<u>Sunday Resurrection Hymn</u>: Ton synanarchon Logon (Tone 5)... (Let us, the faithful, praise and worship the Word, coeternal with the Father and the Spirit, Who for our salvation was born of a Virgin for He willed to be lifted up bodily upon the Cross, to endure death and to raise the dead by His glorious Resurrection.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis...(As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you, O Great Martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Hymn for St. Gregory of Caesarea</u>: En prosefches gree-grorohn...(By your accomplishments, you earned the name that you bore, for you were vigilant in prayer and diligent in working miracles. Therefore, holy father Gregory, intercede with Christ our God, that He illumine our souls, lest we fall asleep in sin unto death.)

<u>Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday</u>: O katharotatos nah-ohs... (The Savior's most pure and immaculate temple, the very precious bridal chamber and Virgin, who is the sacred treasure of the glory of God, on this day is introduced into the House of the Lord, and with herself she brings the grace in the divine Spirit. She is extolled by the Angels of God. A heavenly tabernacle is she.)

Axion Estin - page 52 in our Divine Liturgy books. Communion Hymn- Enite ton Kyrion ...(Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest. Allelouia.)

EPISTLE— Gal. 6:11-18 --- Brethren, see with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that would compel you to be circumcised, and only in order that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. For even those who receive circumcision do not themselves keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may glory in your flesh. But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. Peace and mercy be upon all who walk by this rule, upon the Israel of God. Henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.


