# **Holy Communion Order**

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

# GOD'S VOICE WITHIN US

St. Paul reminds us, by way of today's passage from his Epistle to the Romans, that one thing common to all people in every place and at all times is that within them there is a divine conscience. "Those who are not under the Law of Moses, those who do not know of Christ, have an internal law from God, the natural law written into their hearts..." (Orthodox Study Bible [NT], pg. 341).

St. John of Kronstadt explains: "The conscience in people is none other that the voice of Almighty God moving in their hearts - the

Lord knows all things...Follow your heart throughout your whole life. Examine it; listen to it and see what keeps it from union with the Lord. Let this be your highest and constant concern..." (My Life With Christ, pg. 405).

The "inner law" which is written in people's hearts is that which guides us in understanding "right" from "wrong" — that which benefits self and others" from that which harms self and others. This natural law will grow in us through the grace of the Holy Spirit, whereby the soul

#### THE MISSION OF THE HOLY APOSTLES

The Holy Apostles of Christ had as their chief duty to bear witness to the Savior Jesus Christ, His life, teaching, and atoning work, and especially to bear witness to Christ's resurrection, "a witness to his resurrection", "proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead." "And with great power the Apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 1:22; 4:2,33).

The influence of their witness and testimony was enormous. They simply stated what they knew. There was no doubt in their minds as to the certainty of their knowledge. St. John, in finishing his Gospel, sealed it thus: "This is the disciple who bears witness to these things" (21:24); and in starting his first Epistle he states firmly: "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have looked upon and our hands have handled, of the Word of life ... That which we have seen and heard we declare unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son, Jesus Christ"

(1 John 1:1-3).

The ministry of the Apostles was guided and blessed, and they were aware of this. They felt the presence of Christ and the companionship of the Holy Spirit in every step and turn of their work.

Ο Άγιος Παύλος μας υπενθυμίζει μέσω της επιστολής του προς τους Ρωμαίους ότι ένα πράγμα που είναι κοινό σε όλους τους ανθρώπους είναι η έμφυτη θεϊκή συνείδησή τους. «Οι άνθρωποι που δεν υπάγονται στον Νόμο του Μωυσή και εκείνοι που δεν γνωρίζουν τον Χριστό έχουν έναν εσωτερικό νόμο από τον Θεό - τον φυσικό νόμο που γράφεται στις καρδιές.» (Orthodox Study Bible [NT], pg. 341).

Ο Άγιος Ιωάννης του Κρόνσταντ εξηγεί: «Η συνείδηση στους ανθρώπους δεν είναι τίποτα άλλο παρά η φωνή του παντοδύναμου Θεού που κινείται στην καρδιά - ο Κύριος γνωρίζει όλα ... Παρακολουθήστε την καρδιά σας καθ 'όλη τη διάρκεια της ζωής σας. Εξετάστε την, ακούστε την και δείτε τι την εμποδίζει να ενωθεί με τον Κύριο. Ας είναι αυτή η ανώτατη και διαρκής μελέτη σας ...»

Ο «εσωτερικός νόμος» που είναι γραμμένος στις καρδιές των ανθρώπων είναι αυτός που καθοδηγεί τον ανθρωπον να κατανοήσει το «σωστό» από το «λάθος» – από ό, τι «ωφελεί τον εαυτόν μας και τους άλλους» από αυτό που «βλάπτει τον εαυτό μας και τους άλλους». Αυτός ο φυσικός νόμος θα αυξηθεί μέσα μας με τη χάρη του Αγίου Πνεύματος. Ως αποτέλεσμα, η ψυχή υποτάσσεται πραγματικά στον Θεό. Παύει να έχει τη δική του θέληση. Η μόνη του θέληση είναι να κάνει το θέλημα του Θεού πιο τέλεια. Τίποτα άλλο δεν μπορεί να ευχαριστήσει μια τέτοια ψυχή.

Ο τελικός σκοπός του Μυστηρίου της Ιεράς Εξομολογήσεως είναι να αυξηθούν οι δυνάμεις της ψυχής ώστε να ομιάσει ο άνθρωπος με την αγιότητα του Κυρίου και να νικήσει το κάθε ατυχία και κακό. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

voluntarily places itself under the authority of God. The soul then stops having its own will and, instead, seeks the Will of God. From the experience of the Saints, there is nothing else that can bring more joy to such a soul. Accordingly, the ultimate goal of the Sacrament of Holy Confession is to strengthen the powers of one's soul in resembling the holiness of God in order to overcome every form of evil and misfortune.

What is clearly seen in the media today is growing disregard on the part of society for traditional Christian values. Therefore, we can only wonder how the souls of our youth might be adversely affected. The lines between "right" and "wrong" are becoming increasingly blurred and the human conscience is growing cold. People are making choices no longer based on the solid foundations of God's Law, but instead primarily on the basis of unchecked emotions. Hence, *feelings* dictate *principles*, and the principles of God's Commandments are being constantly compromised. Therefore, the general awareness of sin nearly vanishes, meaning that forgiveness is not being sought and repentance is not contemplated. In the end, people are found justifying sins, holding prejudices and grudges from the past, as well as losing hope for the future.

In today's Gospel passage we are reminded that, upon being called by Jesus, the Apostles "left their nets and followed Him." This does not mean that they abandoned their responsibilities to their loved ones — and certainly they went on to work gathering fish from the sea. (We note the fact that they were still fishing when Jesus, having resurrected from the dead, greeted them on the beach.) But, significantly, they left *their past* behind, following our Lord's words, *Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand.*" (St. Matthew 4:20).

It's been said by many, "You can't carry your cross when you are still holding on to your nets." Repentance requires that we leave the past behind us, neither resting on laurels of past good deeds, nor sulking in hopelessness over past sins. If we have sinned, we need to correct our lives today so that we can continue to draw closer to our Savior tomorrow. If we have been virtuous, we need to practice virtue today so that we can continue to grow in Christ's grace tomorrow. All of this, of course, depends on our willingness to listen to God's voice speaking to us through our conscience. +FR. THEODORE

**EPISTLE - Rom. 2:10-16** 

Brethren, glory and honor and peace for every one who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek. For God shows no partiality. All who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will be justified. When Gentiles who have not the law do by nature what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law. They show that what the law requires is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness and their conflicting thoughts accuse or perhaps excuse them on that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus.

GOSPEL - St. Matthew 4:18-23

At that time, as Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Immediately they left their nets and followed him. And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left their boat and their father, and followed him. And he went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every infirmity among the people.


