Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiv-ing.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

As the One True God, our Savior knows the soul of every person in the world. In today's Gospel passage we heard how He knew Nathaniel, for whom He said: *"See a true Israelite in whom there is no deceit."* (St. John 1:48). Indeed, in this way, Nathaniel understood that Jesus is God, Who knows the heartbeat of each one of us.

God took on the "image" of Man, who is created in the Image and Likeness of God. This reality is expressly made evident by way of the Holy Icons, the Restoration of which we commemorate toay. Our "Life in Christ" (i.e., our spiritual life) is a way of living in which we dedicate everything about ourselves to the glory of God. As such, it is a lifestyle that is an image of the Heavenly life with God, even though we live in this present world.

Bishop Nicolae of the Romanian Orthodox Church in the Americas once wrote the following: "The icon is based not only on the Incarnation of the Son of God but also on His Resurrection. Without Christ's Resurrection the icon would not be a representation of transfigured life, but only a commemorative painting. This Continued on page 2

THE CORONAVIRUS & HOLY COMMUNION – Indeed, it is wise to follow the proper, physician-directed guidelines for protecting ourselves from the coronavirus. Given this, let us not forget that we are summoned to approach Holy Communion with *faith* and with *love*. We must have faith in Christ our True God, Who cured all maladies and He even raised the dead. Christ our God is truly the Physician of our souls and bodies – and it is His Very Body and Blood that we receive through the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

It is truly a miracle that clergy (bishops, priests, deacons) have not contracted any illnesses from hundreds of people who receive Holy Communion, who knowingly or unknowingly harbor some disease. All clergy completely consume Holy Communion at every weekday and Sunday Liturgy *after* everyone in church has received the Sacrament. In addition, priests on a weekly basis give Holy Communion to hospital patients stricken with everything from pneumonia to HIV. Yet, every Sunday and weekday they are celebrating the Divine Liturgy with you "hale and hearty" year after year. We note that, down through the ages, there are examples of saintly priests who have administered Holy Communion to lepers in leper colonies and who never contracted leprosy.

Let us all, then, *receive Holy Communion with faith*! +FR. THEODORE

Ως ο μόνος αληθινός Θεός, ο Χριστός γνωρίζει την ψυχή του κάθε ανθρώπου του κόσμου. Στην σημερινήν Ευαγγελικήν περικοπήν, ακούσαμε πώς εγνώρισε τον Ναταναήλ, γιά τον οποίον είπε, «Ιδε αληθώς Ισραηλίτης εν ω δόλος ουκ εστι.» (Ιωαν. 1.48). Μάλιστα, κατά αυτόν τον τρόπον, ο Ναταναήλ καταλάβαινε ότι ο Ιησούς είναι ο Θεός, Ο Οποίος γνωρίζει τον καρδιακό παλμό του κάθε ανθρώπου.

Ο Θεός ανέλαβε την «εικόνα» του ανθρώπου, ο οποίος είναι πλασμένος εις την εικόνα και την ομοίωσην του Θεού. Αυτή η πραγματικότης είναι έντονα εμφανής δια μέσου των αγίων εικόνων, την αναστύλωση των οποίων μνημονεύουμεν σήμερα. Η «εν Χριστώ» ζωή του ανθρώπου είναι τρόπος ζωής αφιερωμένη προς δόξαν Θεού. Ως εκ τούτου, είναι τρόπος ζωής που είναι εικόνα της επουρινίου ζωής, ενώ ζούμεν μέσα σε τούτον τον επίγειον κόσμον.

Ο Επίσκοπος Νικόλαος της Ρουμανικής Ορθοδόξου Αρχιεπισκοπής στην Αμερική γράφει: «Η εικόνα βασίζεται όχι μόνο στην ενσάρκωση του Υιού του Θεού, αλλά και στην Ανάστασή Του. Χωρίς την Ανασταση του Χριστού η εικόνα δεν θα ήταν μια αναπαράσταση της μεταμορφωμένης ζωής, αλλά μόνο μια αναμνηστική ζωγραφική. Αυτό σημαίνει ότι η εικόνα φέρνει τον Θεό μέσα μας, ενώ μας δίνει και την κατανόηση της ζωής μας ως συμμετέχοντες στη ζωή του Θεού.»

Η Μεγάλη Σαρακοστή είναι μια ευκαιρία να ενισχύσουμε την πίστη μας και με αυτόν τον τρόπο να αφιερώσουμε τη ζωή μας στον Χριστό όπως ακριβώς έκαναν οι άγιοι.

means that the icon brings God among us while it also raises us to the understanding of our life as participants in the life of God." ("Journey to Pascha: 'Sunday of Orthodoxy-The First Sunday of Lent,'" IOCC publication, pg. 2).

In his book, Our Thoughts Determine our Lives, Elder Thaddeus of Vitovnica, writes: "Let the mind pray from the heart. Thus, gradually, we will become accustomed to prayer, and prayer will become a habit to us...When the Lord sees our endeavors, and sees that we seek Him and wish to be with Him in all eternity, then He will give us strength, and the heart then will dwell in our prayer. Then we will do our work while listening to the prayer in us."

The Holy Icons are vehicles for prayer. It is fitting, therefore, to begin the Lenten Season with a procession of Icons through which we are reminded that this is truly the season to pray. At the heart of prayer, however, there is the matter of our frame of mind. Prayer is not simply "positive thinking," nor is it a "wish list," that is based on our will, rather than on God's Will. Prayer is less about asking our Lord to give us *things*, and more about asking to *be* the person that our Lord wants us to become. Prayer is the energy of our love for God and the people around us. In essence, prayer is energy on our part directed to Christ our God, which emanates from within our minds and souls. The fruits of prayer is the acquisition of Wisdom given through the Holy Spirit and the many gifts of the Spirit. Hence, the value of inner, contemplative, silent prayer is of primary importance in terms of navigating the many concerns and challenges in our lives.

The Holy Icons speak unspoken language of God's love. They reflect the peace that is characteristic of a life in God's Kingdom where there is no pain, or sorrow or sighing — where there is no anxiety or fear. It is the language we universally understand, because it is in our very nature to be able to comprehend it and it is within the power of our human nature to communicate this Divine language to those around us. +FR.THEODORE

EPISTLE -Rom. 13:11-14; 14:1-4 Brethren, salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. ANTIPHON I : "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...)

<u>Verse 1</u>-- The Lord reigns; He clothed Himself with majesty; the Lord clothed and girded Himself with power. And He established the world, which shall not be moved. *Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."*

<u>Verse 2-</u> Who shall tell the mighty deeds of the Lord, who shall make all His praises heard? *Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas.*

<u>Verse 3</u>- Let those redeemed by the Lord say so, whom He redeemed from the hand of the enemy. *Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."*

Chanter(s): Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> Let them give thanks to the Lord for His mercies and His wonders to the sons of men. Let them exalt Him in the assembly of the people and praise Him in the seat of the elders. *Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."*

<u>Verse 2 –</u> The eyes of the Lord are on those who hope in His mercy. *Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who Arose from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia."*

Verse 3 – To hear the groaning of those bound, to set free the sons of the slain.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

Doxa Patri ke Yio ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei... "O Monogenis Yios ke Logos tou Theou..."

ANTIPHON III- This is the day the Lord made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

<u>Sunday Resurrection Hymn</u>: Ton synanarchon (Tone 5)... (Let us, the faithful, praise and worship the Word, coeternal with the Father and the Spirit, Who for our salvation was born of a Virgin for He willed to be lifted up bodily upon the Cross, to endure death and to raise the dead by His glorious Resurrection.)

<u>Hymn for The Sunday of Orthodoxy</u>: Tin achrandon eikona Sou... (We venerate Your immaculate icon, O good Lord, and entreat You to forgive our offences, O Christ our God. By Your own choice you were pleased to ascend the Cross in the flesh, to deliver us, whom You created, from our slavery to the foe. Therefore we cry to You with gratitude: You have filled all things with joy, O our Savior, by coming to save the world.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis...(*As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you. O great martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.*)

<u>Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday</u>: Ti ypermacho...(O Champion General, I your City now ascribe to you triumphant anthems as the tokens of my gratitude, being rescued from the terrors, O Theotokos. Inasmuch as you have power unassailable, from all kinds of perils free me so that unto you I may cry aloud: Rejoice, O unwedded Bride.)

<u>Instead of "Axion Estin,": Epi Si Cheri ke Charitomeni</u>.... See the English translation on page 135 of our Divine Liturgy books ("In you, O woman full of grace...)

SERVICE OF THE PROCESSION OF THE HOLY ICONS

Following the conclusion of the Doxology, the altar boys and those participating in the Procession, with Icons, fans and candles, proceed in a counter-clockwise direction, stopping at four stations as the faithful chant: *"Your undefiled icon we venerate Lord, asking for forgiveness of all our faults, O Christ our God; for of Your own will You were pleased to ascend in the flesh upon the Cross to de-liver those You created from the bondage of the foe. Wherefore, in thanksgiving we cry to You: You have filled all things with joy, O our Savior, now that You have come to save all the world."*

At the first station, the Deacon exclaims petitions praying for the health and salvation of all Orthodox Christians. The priest concludes with: *"For You are a merciful God Who loves mankind and to You do we give glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit now and forever and to the ages of ages."* The faithful then chant the above hymn again.

At the second station the Deacon exclaims petitions praying for the Eternal Life and blessed memory of our sacred forefathers and relatives. The priest concludes: **"For You are the Resurrection, the Life and the Repose..."** The faithful then chant the above hymn again.

At the third station the Deacon exclaims petitions praying for the safe-keeping of our Church clergy and lay leaders, parents, grandparents and relatives. The priest concludes with, *"For You are a merciful God Who loves mankind..."* The faithful then chant the above hymn again.

At the fourth station the Deacon exclaims petitions praying for the safe-keeping of our Church and our general community. As before, the priest concludes with, *"For You are a merciful God Who loves mankind..."*

The Priest then reads the Synodikon Statement, as the faithful follow along:

"As the Prophets beheld; as the Apostles have taught; as the Teachers have dogmatized; as the Universe has agreed; as grace has shown forth: As Truth was revealed; as falsehood has been dissolved; as wisdom has presented; as Christ awarded: Thus we declare; thus we assert; thus we preach Christ our True God, and honor His Saints in words; in writings; in thoughts; in sacrifices; in churches; in Holy Icons; on the one hand worshiping and reverencing Christ as God and Lord, and on the other, honoring them as true servants of the same Lord of all and offering them the proper veneration. This is the Faith of the Apostles; this is the Faith of the Fathers; This is the Faith of the Orthodox. This is the Faith which has established the universe. Furthermore, to these messengers of piety, with brotherly and fatherly love and reverence, in glory and honor of piety for which they fought, we praise and cry out: of all the defenders of Orthodoxy, pious kings, most holy Patriarchs, bishops, teachers, martyrs, confessors, Eternal be their memory." The faithful respond; "Memory Eternal; Memory Eternal".

The Priest continues: "We today, entreating God that we be instructed and strengthened by their exploits and struggles and teachings for piety unto death, and praying to become imitators of their Godly life unto the end, may we prove worthy of all these requests by the compassion and grace of Christ the Great and First Arch-Priest and our True God; through the intercessions of our Most Glorious Lady Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary, the God-like Angels and all the Saints, Amen."

Then all the faithful chant: *"Who is so great a God as our God! You are the God Who works wonders."* This stanza is repeated after each of the following verses: – "<u>You have made known Your</u> <u>power to the nations.</u>" – "<u>And I said: Now I began to understand; this is a change in the work of</u> <u>the right hand of the Most High.</u>" – <u>"I remember the works of the Lord; for I will remember Your</u> <u>wonders from the beginning.</u>"

Then, the faithful together read the Creed on page 42 of our Divine Liturgy Books.

The Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great begins.
