SUNDAY BEFORE THE NATIVITY OF CHRIST

PROPHESIES FULFILLED!

References are made in both the Gospel and the Epistles passages today of the Prophets and forefathers described in the Old Testament. Not only is the prophesy of Christ's life-saving ministry in the world made known through the individual Prophets themselves, but it is made known through the historical events recorded in the Old Testament.

One such event is the Exodus. In itself, it is the prophesy of God saving humanity from slavery to sin and its deliverance into the "Promised Land" of repentance, forgiveness and eternal salvation. The

burning bush, which was on fire, yet remained unburned, is a prophesy of the Person of the Ever-Virgin, Who received Christ through the Holy Spirit, yet remained Ever-Virgin. Also, the crossing of the Red Sea is a prophesy of Holy Baptism, in which case we leave the old world of slavery to sin and turn to the new world of virtue in Christ. The Ten Commandments contain the expression of God's love for humanity, summarized in Christ's teaching that they hang upon two commandments: 1) love for God, and, 2) love for neighbor. THE SUNDAY BEFORE THE NATIVITY OF CHRIST OUR GOD

On the Sunday that occurs on or immediately after the eighteenth of this month, we celebrate all those who from ages past have been well-pleasing to God, beginning from Adam even unto Joseph the Betrothed of the Most Holy Theotokos, according to genealogy, as the Evangelist Luke hath recorded historically (Luke 3:23-38); we also commemorate the Prophets and Prophetesses, and especially the Prophet Daniel and the Holy Three Children.

The Apolytikion Hymn for this Sunday:

"Great are the accomplishments of faith. In the fountain of flame the three Holy Youths rejoiced as though they were resting by the waters. And the Prophet Daniel showed himself to be a shepherd to the lions, as though they were sheep. Through their prayers O Christ our God, save our souls."

Αναφορές γίνονται τόσο στις σημερινές περικοπές του Ευαγγελίου όσο και της Επιστολής περί των Προφητών και των προπατόρων που περιγράφονται στην Παλαιά Διαθήκη. Όχι μόνο η γνώσις περί της διακονίας του Χριστού γίνεται μέσω των ίδιων των Προφητών, αλλά και μέσω των ιστορικών γεγονότων που καταγράφονται στην Παλαιά Διαθήκη.

Ένα τέτοιο γεγονός είναι η Έξοδος. Από μόνη της, είναι η προφητεία ότι ο Θεός θα σώσει την ανθρωπότητα από τη σκλαβιά της αμαρτίας και θα φέρει τους ανθρώπους στον «παράδεισο» της μετάνοιας, της συγχωρήσεως και της αιωνίου σωτηρίας. Ο φλεγόμενος θάμνος, που φλεγόταν, αλλά παρέμεινε άκαυτος, είναι μια προφητεία της Παναγίας, που συνέλαβε τον Χριστό μέσω του Αγίου Πνεύματος, αλλά παραμένει πάντα Παρθένος. Επίσης, η διάβασις της Ερυθράς Θαλάσσης είναι μια προφητεία του Αγίου Βαπτίσματος, οπότε αφήνουμε τον παλιό κόσμο της δουλείας της αμαρτίας και στρεφόμεθα στον νέο κόσμο της εν Χριστώ αρετής. Οι Δέκα Εντολές περιέχουν την έκφραση της αγάπης του Θεού για την ανθρωπότητα, που συνοψίζεται στη διδασκαλία του Χριστού ότι ολα βασίζονται στις δυο εντολές: 1) να αγαπάμε τον Θεό και, 2) να αγαπάμε τον πλησίον μας.

Αυτά τα «υπογεγονότα» στην Έξοδο -- η διάβασις της Ερυθράς Θαλάσσης και η έκδοσις των Δέκα Εντολων -- είναι από μόνα τους διακηρύξεις που εκφωνούνται από την ουράνια χορωδία με τον Χριστό ξαπλωμένο στη φάτνη: «Δόξα εν υψίστοις Θεώ και επί γης ειρήνη και ανθρώποις ευδοκία». +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

dus are in themselves proclamations uttered by the heavenly choir with Christ lying in the manger: "Peace on earth and goodwill toward all," thereby fulfilling Old Testament prophesy.

Of special importance is Moses' inner character, which is common to us all, as revealed in his dialogue with our Lord at the burning bush. Moses was called by God to do God's Will. In like manner, we too are called to do God's Will daily and in various ways. While God does not need us to exist, God wants to honor us as co-workers in the work of divine love. However, being such co-workers is not popular in a world in which sin has given way to ingrained habits of self-worship and also hatefulness, making it a "martyr-like" challenge to deliver people from sin into salvation.

Like Moses, we too are tempted to resist our calling by coming up with one excuse after another. And, like with Moses, God keeps assuring us that He will be with us all the way. Finally, like Moses, we confess our lack of faith by suggesting that God makes mistakes when we are called to do His Will. To the core, we imply that we feel incapable of repentance itself. We might find ourselves giving the impression that we would like to justify our *fear* of doing God's Will, which requires us to change our thinking, which can be a fearful thing to do, especially if we lack faith that God will be with us.

God communicates with us in His Personhood -- in the Person of Christ, the Word. In "personhood," God shares our joys; our sorrows, and our frustrations. Thus, in "personhood" God expressed frustration over Moses' weak faith and sent the Levite Priest Aaron to accompany Moses through his weaknesses. In like manner, God sends us the Holy Priesthood, which is the "personhood" of the Church, and Who is responsible, like Aaron, to help those called by God to do the work of God.

As we celebrate the Nativity of Christ, let us strengthen our faith and know that "God is with us," which is, in fact, the name: Emmanuel. +FR. THEODORE

EPISTLE -- Hebrews 11:9-10, 32-40

Brethren, by faith Abraham sojourned in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God. And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were tempted, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, illtreated—of whom the world was not worthy —wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

GOSPEL - St. Matthew 1:1-25

The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers, and Judah the father of Perez and Zerah by Tamar, and Perez the father of Hezron, and Hezron the father of Ram, and Ram the father of Ammin'adab, and Ammin'adab the father of Nahshon, and Nahshon the father of Salmon, and Salmon the father of Bo'az by Rahab, and Bo'az the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of David the king. And David was the father of Solomon by the wife of Uri'ah, and Solomon the father of Rehobo'am,

and Rehobo'am the father of Abi'jah, and Abi'jah the father of Asa, and Asa the father of Jehosh'aphat, and Jehosh 'aphat the father of Joram, and Joram the father of Uzzi'ah, and Uzzi' ah the father of Jotham, and Jotham the father of Ahaz, and Ahaz the father of Hezeki'ah, and Hezeki'ah the father of Manas'seh, and Manas'seh the father of Amos, and Amos the father of Josi 'ah, and Josi'ah the father of Jechoni'ah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon. And after the deportation to Babylon: Jechoni'ah was the father of Sheal'tiel, and Sheal'tiel the father of Zerub'babel, and Zerub' babel the father of Abi'ud, and Abi'ud the father of Eli'akim, and Eli'akim the father of Azor, and Azor the father of Zadok, and Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim the father of Eli'ud, and Eli'ud the father of Elea'zar, and Elea'zar the father of Matthan, and Matthan the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ. So all the generations from Abraham to David were fourteen generations, and from David to the deportation to Babylon fourteen generations, and from the deportation to Babylon to the Christ fourteen generations. Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child of the Holy Spirit; and her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her guietly. But as he considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emman'uel" (which means, God with us). When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took his wife, but knew her not until she had borne a son; and he called his name Jesus.




