#### **Holy Communion Order**

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

#### SELF-CONDEMNATION

In the Orthodox Church Service book known as *The Great Horologion*, we find the Church Services of "The Hours," read in monasteries at fixed hours throughout the day. In the Service of Hours, there is a prayer read toward the end of each "hour:" "O Christ our God, Who is long-suffering, rich in mercy and most compassionate; Who loves the righteous and has mercy on sinners... Sanctify our souls; purify our bodies; correct our thoughts; make our intentions holy

and deliver us from every sorrow, evil and pain." A shorter version of such a prayer, it could be said, is "The Jesus Prayer:" "O Lord, Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner." Indeed, a majority of our Church Prayers are patterned after the sentiments of the Publican of today's Gospel passage, who prayed for God's mercy.

There are three points to such prayer:
1) Jesus Christ is the Only-Begotten
Son of God and He is our Savior; 2)
we acknowledge that Jesus is God,

**THE TRIODION** -- The Triodion (pronounced in Greek: Tri-oh-dhi-ohn) is a liturgical book used by the Orthodox Church. The book contains the rubrics for the fasting period preceding Easter (Pascha). The "Kanonion" Hymns for weekday Orthros Services in the Triodion contain only three odes and so are known as "tri-odes" after which the Triodion takes its name.

The period which the book covers extends from the **Sunday of the Publican** and **Pharisee** (this Sunday, February 13th), and concludes with the **Midnight Resurrection Service** in celebration of our Lord's Resurrection from the dead (April 24th). **The Triodion season** begins 3 weeks before Great Lent with a week in which there is no fasting, including on Wednesdays and Fridays, which are normally kept as fast days throughout the year (with few exceptions). The normal fasting rule, however, is restored until "Meatfare Sunday" (a.k.a. "Judgment Sunday"), after which fasting from meat begins. The following Sunday, known as "Cheesefare Sunday" (a.k.a. "Forgiveness Sunday), brings in the fast from dairy.

The day after "Cheesefare Sunday" is **the First Day of Great Lent**, known as "**Clean Monday**," (March 7th) and the fasting diet is strict. People are encouraged to fast as best as they can, regulating their personal fasting discipline in accordance with their medical concerns, ideally, in consultation with their priest-confessor.

Υπάρχει «Προσευχητάριον» της Ορθόδοξης Εκκλησίας, που γνωρίζεται ως Το Μεγά Ωρολόγιο, όπου ευρίσκουμε τις Εκκλησιαστικές Ακολουθίες των «Ωρών», που εκτελούνται στα μοναστήρια σε καθορισμένες ώρες όλη την ημέρα κάθε ημέρα. Στην Λειτουργία των Ωρών, υπάρχει μιά προσευχή που διαβάζεται προς το τέλος κάθε «Ωρας:»...«Ο εν παντί καιρώ και πάση ώρα εν Ουρανώ και επί γης προσκυνούμενος και δοξαζόμενος, Χριστός ο Θεός, ο μακρόθυμος, ο πολυέλεος, ο πολυεύσπλαχνος, ο τους δικαίους αγαπών και τους αμαρτωλούς ελεών ... τας ψυχάς ημών αγίασον, τα σώματα άγνισον, τους λογισμούς διόρθωσον, τας εννοίας κάθαρον, και ρόσαι ημάς από πάσης θλίψεως...»

Υπάρχουν τρία θέματα σχετικά σε μια τέτοια προσευχή: 1) Ο Ιησούς Χριστός είναι ο Μονογενής Υιός του Θεού προς σωτηρίαν μας. 2) αναγνωρίζουμε ότι ο Ιησούς είναι Θεός, ο Οποίος είναι ο Μόνος Κριτής, που έχει εξουσία να δείχνει να συγχωρεί τις αμαρτίες, και, 3) έχουμεν ανάγκη από το έλεος του Θεού, επειδή διαπράττουμε αμαρτίες μέσω των οποίων αποκρύπτουμε την αγάπη μας από τον Θεό και από τους άλλους. Η προσευχή και η ταπεινοφροσύνη πάνε χέριχέρι. Χρειάζεται να είμεθα αρκετά ταπεινοί για να συνειδητοποιήσουμε την ανάγκη που έχουμε για το έλεος του Θεού και να προσευχόμεθα ανάλογα. Ο Τελώνης ήταν ταπεινός.

Η υπερηφάνεια του Φαρισαίου εκδηλώθηκε στο «ευχαριστώ» του επειδή μπορούσε να νηστέψει, να δώσει τα «δέκατα» και να τηρήσει το Σάββατο. Μόλις είπε, ομως, «Δεν είμαι καν σαν αυτόν τον άνθρωπο», έχασε τη σωτηρία, γιατί καταδίκασε τον συνάνθρωπό του. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

Who is the Only Judge, having the authority to show mercy and to forgive sins, and, 3) we need God's mercy, because we commit sins by withholding love from God and others. Prayer and humility go hand-in-hand. We need to be humble enough to realize our need for God's mercy and to pray accordingly. Otherwise, we fall into "self-condemnation," the cause of which is our pride.

The Pharisee of today's Gospel shows us how easy it is to fall into such a peril as "self-condemnation," and, therefore, how important it is to be aware of our thoughts and motives and to evaluate them, through prayer, as to whether they are reflective of God's love. Of course, if they are not reflective of God's love, we are responsible to pray for God's help for us to correct such thoughts and motives.

The pride of the Pharisee was manifested in the following way: 1) he praised himself for tithing and fasting. 2) his own words, "I am not like others, not even like this man (referring to the Publican), were the very words which condemned him. Thanking God for being able to fast and tithe was the good part of his prayer. As soon as he said, "not even like this guy," he lost salvation, because he condemned his fellow human being. By condemning others we condemn ourselves. We lose salvation and inherit eternal torment.

Let us strive to be careful with our thoughts and motives so that we do not condemn ourselves to eternal torment outside of God's Kingdom. Let us, instead, be steadfast in mind, soul and body in committing ourselves and one another to Christ our God. +FR. THEODORE
