### **Holy Communion Order**

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

## A NEW PERSONALITY

By way of His Baptism, Christ took onto Himself the sins of humanity and, in this way, He opened for us the door to repentance.

Regarding the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, Nicholas Cabasilas wrote: "These therefore are the effects of Baptism: to set free from sins; to reconcile the person to God; to unite the person with God and to open the eyes that souls might perceive the divine ray—in sum, to prepare for the life to come." (The Life in Christ, pg. 101).

Metropolitan Hierotheos of Nafpaktos and St. Vlasios wrote: "Christ was baptized so that He could obey the Law and bring His Grace into the Water, to all of creation, and to humanity. By this, He gave to each of us the ability to acquire the Grace of adoption -- which is an Epiphany in one's personal life. This manifestation of God acquaints one with the knowledge of God as an existential fact, which is why it leads us to salvation." (Major Feast Days of the Orthodox Church, pg. 124). #### CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

We all know the story of Jesus feeding the five thousand in the wilderness --there was no food, except for five loaves and two fish – not much when you consider 5000 men. But Jesus blessed the loaves, multiplied them and used them to
feed the 5000. Jesus used what was given to Him to perform a beautiful miracle.
In offering even five loaves and two fish, we offer what we have – however great
or small our gift. If we do this prayerfully and in humility, God will take our
gifts and multiply them in order to feed His people.

In the Divine Liturgy, the bishop prays that the Lord will visit and confirm the vineyard which is the parish, the local Body of Christ, which the Lord planted with His own right hand (Ps 79:15-16). He Provides so that we may bear fruit. Saint John Chrysostom emphasized Christ's continual presence with us -- the True Vine that is always connected to the branches, giving them life. Christ shows His great love for us by "remaining continually with those who shall bring forth fruit; for it is needful to enjoy His aid and so to bear fruit." St. John Chrysostom says in his "Homily 77" On the Gospel of Saint Matthew,

"Christ, in His great love for us, has joined Himself to us and offers us all that we need to bear good fruit that will lead us and others to salvation." (Taken from <a href="www.goarch.org">www.goarch.org</a>)

Με το Βάπτισμά Του, ο Χριστός ανέλαβε πάνω Του τις αμαρτίες της ανθρωπότητος και, με αυτόν τον τρόπο, μας άνοιξε την πόρτα της μετάνοιας.

Ο Μητροπολίτης Ναυπάκτου και Αγίου Βλασίου, κ.κ. Ιερόθεος έγραψε: «Ο Χριστός εβαπτίστηκε για να υπακούσει στο Νόμο και να φέρει τη Χάρη Του στο νερό, σε όλη την κτίση και στην ανθρωπότητα. Έτσι, έδωσε στον καθένα μας τη δυνατότητα να αποκτήσει την Χάρη της υιοθεσίας -δηλ., τα Θεοφάνεια στην προσωπική του ζωήν. Αυτή η φανέρωση του Θεού συνιστά την Θεογνωσία, την γνώση του Θεού, και επιδή η Θεογνωσία είναι υπαρξιακό γεγονός, για αυτό και αυτή προξένει την σωτηρίαν. (Οι Δεσποτικές Εορτές, σελ. 124). Αυτό δεν είναι απλώς «φιλοσοφία». Είναι η πραγματικότης.

Το Μυστήριο του Βαπτίσματος είναι η εν Χριστώ γέννησή μας. Φυσικά, γεννιόμεθα μόνο μία φορά. Η Θεια Εξομολόγησις είναι η εν Χριστώ θεραπεία μας λόγω των μαχών μας με την αμαρτία. Και τα δύο αυτά Μυστήρια δημιουργούν μέσα μας έναν «νέο άνθρωπον». Αυτός ο «νέος άνθρωπος » είναι στην πραγματικότητα μια νέα προσωπικότης, μια νέα ιδιοσυγκρασία, με ένα νέο σύνολο αξιών και μια ανανεωμένη ικανότητα να είναι ο άνθρωπος υπομονετικός, συγχωρητικός, εμποτισμένος με τη Σοφία του Θεού.

osophy;" it is *reality*. The fact that God gave us a soul makes it a reality for each of us. It means that we are much more than something that "evolved" from a flawed, or mutated nature. We gain nothing by trying to justify our spiritual weaknesses as natural, "because we are only human."

The Sacrament of Baptism is our birth in Christ. Of course, we are born only once. Holy Confession is our healing in Christ as the result of our battles with sin. Both of these Sacraments create in us a "new self." This new self is actually a new personality; a new temperament, with a new set of values and a renewed ability to be patient, forgiving, imbued with Wisdom of God. Such a change in our personhood requires prayer and effort, because part of our old self has with it old habits. As a new self emerges with Christ in our lives, we seek to build new habits. To quote Nicholas Cabasilas again: "It is only with difficulty and intense effort that we can break long-standing habits and introduce what is real in place of that which is merely apparent, and what is good in place of that which is merely pleasant." (pg. 171)

The re-creation of humanity by virtue of the Incarnation and Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ is a reality that has been manifested in the lives of many sinners who became Saints. Armed with their renewed personhood in the image of Christ and with the grace of the Holy Spirit, the Saints allowed themselves to be joined with God's powers, giving them great joy. Despite the trials and tribulations of the world around them, they radiated the joy that is a gift of love. It is joy in the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Let us also seek such divine joy.
