Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

ST. PAUL: THE GREATEST SINNER

We are all sinners. That does not mean that we are depraved; nor does it mean that God has given up on us. It does not mean that we are worthless and there we cannot find joy in life.

In his book, *How to Be a Sinner*, Peter Bouteneff cites today's passage from St. Paul's First Epistle to Timothy: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. And I am the foremost of sinners; but I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display

His perfect patience for an example to those who were to believe in Him for eternal life. (1 Timothy 14-16). St. Paul confesses that he is a great sinner. After all, he was an accomplice to the murder of St. Stephen, the First Martyr. Bouteneff makes the following observation: "We are sinners surrounded by sinners... But this human condition, in all of its depravity, is what Christ came to save..." To paraphrase Bouteneff, we would say that St. Paul's message to us is that if God is patient and for-Continued on page 2

Είμεθα όλοι αμαρτωλοί. Αυτό δεν σημαίνει ότι είμεθα διεφθαρμένοι. ούτε σημαίνει ότι ο Θεός μας έχει εγκαταλείψει. Δεν σημαίνει ότι είμεθα άχρηστοι και δεν μπορούμε να ευρούμε χαρά στη ζωή.

Πολλοί άνθρωποι σήμερα δεν θέλουν να ακούσουν, όμως, τη λέξη «αμαρτία», επειδή, όπως φαίνεται, οι άνθρωποι θέλουν να πείσουν τον εαυτό τους ότι είναι «Ο.Κ. όπως ακριβώς νομίζουν». Μερικοί άνθρωποι κατηγορούν ακόμη και τον Θεό που ζητά πολλά από εμάς, αφού πιστεύουν ότι ό,τι και να κάνουμεν, «είναι ανθρώπινο.»

Πραγματικά, δεν είμεθα "ΟΚ". Βαθιά μέσα μας γνωρίζουμε ότι υπάρχει περιθώριο βελτιώσεως. Ο Άγιος Παύλος δεν ήταν "Ο.Κ." Παραδέχθηκε ότι ήταν αμαρτωλός, αλλά, διά της ψυχικής αγώνος έγινε Άγιος. Το ίδιο ισχύει γιά τον καθέναν μας. Μπορεί να είμεθα αμαρτωλοί, αλλά ο Χριστός πάντα μας καλεί να γίνουμε Άγιοι. Όπως ακριβώς ο Άγιος Παύλος στράφηκε προς τον Χριστό και συγχωρήθηκε, το ίδιο ισχύει για τον καθέναν μας. Δεν πρέπει ποτέ να απελπιζόμεθα. Ο Θεός μας αγαπά και είναι έτοιμος να μας συγχωρήσει αν μετανοήσουμε.

Η Θεία Κοινωνία είναι η διαρκής και ζωντανή μαρτυρία της Αγάπης του Θεού γιά τον καθέναν μας. Σε κάθε Θεία Λειτουργία βιώνουμε την αγαπή του Θεού: «ούτως γαρ ηγάπησεν ο θεός τον κόσμον, ώστε τον Υιόν τον μονογενή έδωκεν, ίνα πας ο πιστεύων εις Αυτόν μη απόληται αλλά έχη ζωήν αιώνιον, ου γαρ απέστειλεν ο Θεός τον Υιόν Αυτού εις τον κόσμον ίνα κρίνη τον κόσμον αλλά ίνα σωθή ο κόσμος δι Αυτού.» (Ιωαν. 3:16-17) +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

giving with a person like St. Paul, then we must believe that God will be merciful to all people.

Many people today do not want to hear the word "sin," because, it would seem, that people want to convince themselves that they are "O.K. just the way they are." Some people even blame God for asking too much from us, since, after all, "we are only human."

Truly, we are not "O.K." Deep down we know there is room for improvement. St. Paul was not "O.K." He admitted to being a sinner; but, he went on to become a Saint. The same is true for each of us. We may be sinners, but Christ our Savior is always calling us to become Saints. Just like St. Paul turned to Christ and was forgiven, the same holds true for each of us. We should never despair. God loves us and is ready to forgive us if we sincerely repent.

Holy Communion is the on-going and living testimony to the Love of God for each of us. At each Divine Liturgy we experience the truth of Holy Scriptures: "For God so loved the world that He gave His Only-Begotten Son, that all who believe in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. For, God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him." (St. John 3:16-17). We should fear that we would ever reject God's love for us, because by rejecting God, we also continue committing sins, which are deeds and words contrary to God's love.

Indeed, let us turn to our Lord and seek forgiveness and offer gratitude for our salvation through a way of life that gives Christ our God glory and that shares His divine love with all people. +FR. THEODORE


