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THE HOLY MYRRHBEARING WOMEN

THE ETERNAL <u>NOW</u>

The event at which the Myrrh-bearing Women went to anoint Jesus' Body at the tomb is itself a revelation about the reality in which each of us lives.

They certainly had a plan to go and anoint Jesus' Body. They prepared the ointments and they planned their timing. Their biggest worry was about the removal of the large stone that was placed over Jesus' tomb. Time and efforts to prepare the ointments and their anxieties over how the large stone was to be moved were wasted. Our Lord had another plan. He was going to arise from the tomb alive, for He is the Author of Life. As many plans as we may have -- even our plans for serving God -- they are subject to change. God's plan supersedes ours -and it is always a better plan.

It helps if we can see things from God's perspective of Eternity. We categorize our lives in terms of past, pre-*Continued on page 2*

STS. JOSEPH OF ARIMATHEA & NICODEMUS

Together with the Myrrhbearing Women today we celebrate the secret disciples of the Savior, Joseph and Nicodemus.

Of these, Nicodemus was probably a Jerusalemite, a prominent leader among the Jews and of the order of the Pharisees, learned in the Law and instructed in the Holy Scriptures. He had believed in Christ when, at the beginning of our Saviour's preaching of salvation, he came to Him by night. Furthermore, he brought some one hundred pounds of myrrh-oils and an aromatic mixture of aloes and spices out of reverence and love for the divine Teacher (John 19:39).

Joseph, who was from the city of Arimathea, was a wealthy and noble man, and one of the counsellors who were in Jerusalem. He went boldly unto Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus, and together with Nicodemus he gave Him burial. Since time did not permit the preparation of another tomb, he placed the Lord's body in his own tomb which was hewn out of rock, as the Evangelist says (Matt. 27:60).

Η περίσταση κατά την οποία οι Μυροφόρες Γυναίκες επήγαν να χρίσουν το Σώμα του Ιησού στον τάφο είναι από μόνη της μια αποκάλυψη για την πραγματικότητα στην οποία ζει ο καθένας μας.

Το περιστατικό με τις Μυροφόρες Γυναίκες λέει κάτι για τις ατομικές μας ταυτότητες. Οι Μυροφόρες Γυναίκες ήταν «μυροφόρες» γυναίκες πριν να συναντήσουν τον Αναστημένο Κύριο. Μετά από αυτό, είναι οι Απόστολοι του Κυρίου, που εκήρυξαν την Ανάστασή Του. Και εμείς έχουμε την ταυτότητά μας σε αυτόν τον παροδικό κόσμο - πάντα αναρωτιόμεθα αν είμεθα «επιτυχημένοι» ή «αποτυχημένοι» ή «ισχυροί» ή «αδύνατοι». Στην πραγματικότητα, ωστόσο, αυτές οι «ταυτότητες» δεν έχουν καμία σχέση με το πώς μας ταυτίζει ο Θεός. Η αγάπη του Θεού για εμάς καθορίζει την ύπαρξή μας πέρα από τη γέννησή μας στον κόσμο και τον θάνατό μας όταν φεύγουμε από αυτόν τον κόσμο.

Για να παραθέσω τον Henri J.M. Nouwen: «Ακριβώς επειδή η αληθινή μας ταυτότητα έχει τις ρίζες της στην άνευ όρων, απεριόριστη αιώνια αγάπη [του Θεού], μπορούμε να ξεφύγουμε από τη θυματοποίηση από το «ρολόι» μας. Η ώρα του ρολογιού είναι ο χρόνος που έχουμε σε αυτόν τον κόσμο... Μπορεί να γίνει εμμονή, ειδικά όταν όλα αυτά που είμεθα συνδέονται με το ρολόι που συνεγίζει να γτυπά... Από την άποψη του Θεού, ο χρόνος του ρολογιού μας είναι ενσωματωμένος στη διαχρονική αγκαλιά του Θεου...» (Here and Now, [Kindle Edition]). Αυτή η διαχρονικότητα της αγάπης του Χριστού του Θεού μας είναι το Αιώνιο Παρόν της Αναστάσεώς Του. sent, and future. We have misgivings over the past and we have anxieties over the future -- and too often we forget that life is to be lived in the present. It is only in the present that we can repent of past sins; it is only in the present that we can express gratitude. What we do in our present moment has much to do with our Eternal Life.

This event involving the Myrrhbearing Women says something about our individual identities. The Myrrhbearing Women *were* "myrrhbearing" women before encountering the Risen Lord. After that, they *are* Apostles, who proclaimed the Resurrection. We too have our identities in this transient world - we are always wondering if we are "successful," or "failures," or, "powerful" or "weak." In truth, however, these "identities" have nothing to do with how we are identified by God. God's love for us defines our personhood as much more that being born into the world and, then, departing from it.

To quote Henri J.M. Nouwen: "Precisely because our true identity is rooted in the unconditional, unlimited everlasting love [of God], we can escape being victimized by our 'clock-time.' Clock-time is the time we have in this world...[It] can become an obsession, especially when all that we are is connected with the clock that keeps ticking...Looked upon from God's perspective, our clock-time is embedded in the timeless embrace of God..." (Here and Now, [Kindle Edition]). This timelessness of the love of Christ our God is the Eternal Now of His Resurrection. Now, indeed, is the day of salvation -- as noted by St. Paul (2 Corinthians 6:2). +FR. THEODORE

EPISTLE - 1 John 1:1-7

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life the life was made manifest, and we saw it, and testify to it, and proclaim to you the eternal life which was with the Father and was made manifest to us - that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you may have fellowship with us; and our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. And we are writing this that our joy may be complete. This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth; but if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

GOSPEL - St. Mark 15:43 - 16:8

At that time, Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and went to Pilate, and asked for the body of Jesus. And Pilate wondered if he were already dead; and sum-

moning the centurion, he asked him whether he was already dead. And when he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the body to Joseph. And he bought a linen shroud, and taking him down, wrapped him in the linen shroud, and laid him in a tomb which had been hewn out of the rock; and he rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses saw where he was laid. And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back; for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.


