### PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE - Hebrews11:9-10, 32-40

Brethren, by faith Abraham sojourned in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God. And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were tempted, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated—of whom the world was not worthy —wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim the father of Eli'ud, and Eli'ud the father of Elea'zar, and Elea'zar the father of Matthan, and Matthan the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ. So all the generations from Abraham to David were fourteen generations, and from David to the deportation to Babylon fourteen generations, and from the deportation to Babylon to the Christ fourteen generations. Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child of the Holy Spirit; and her husband Joseph, being a

just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emman'uel" (which means, God with us). When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took his wife, but knew her not until she had borne a son; and he called his name Jesus.

### **Liturgical Notes for Today**

At the Entrance of the Gospel: 1) **Entrance hymn**: 1) "The women disciples of the Lord heard from the angel the joyful news of the Resurrection and the repeal of the sentence imposed upon our forefathers. With pride, they said to the Apostles, 'Death is vanquished; Christ our God is risen, bestowing upon the world His great mercy.'"/Το φαιδρόν...

- 2) "At that time, Mary, bearing the Immaculate Conception, registered for the census in Bethlehem with Joseph the elder, of the seed of David. ### THE STAR OF BETHLEHEM

Nicholas Cabasilas, in his classic book, *The Life in Christ*, explains that Christ is the Image of each of us in as much as we were created according to His Image and Likeness. Cabasilas notes, "We must regard Christ as the Archetype of the former Adam created from Him." (pg. 191). Gentleness, compassion and glory to God, are the virtues that describe the Person of Christ and, by extension, they are virtues that we are able to personify in our own character, due to the gifts with which God created us. Christ renews our spiritual powers: "It was not the old Adam who was the model for the New; but the New Adam was generated…because of the corruption which the old Adam initiated. (Romans 8:3)." (pg.190).

The image of the Star of Bethlehem is before us during the Divine Liturgy as we celebrate our Savior's Nativity, especially when we chant the Apolytikion: "Your Nativity, [i.e., Your birth into the world] O Christ our God, has caused the light of knowledge to rise upon the world. For therein worshippers of the stars were by a star instructed to worship You, the Sun of Righteousness and to know You as Orient on high. Glory to You, O Lord." The Star is a vehicle for the Holy Spirit to enlighten the world, revealing that Christ is the only True God. As did the Wise Men, we now confess that Christ is God with these words: "We venerate Your Cross, O Christ, and Your Holy Resurrection we praise and glorify; for, You are

our God; we know no other." The presence of the Star in the heavens reminds us that all of humanity is called to worship Christ. The Wise Men and the shepherds represent people from all walks of life. Christ is our God for all people at all times and in all places.

Through the Star of Bethlehem, we are all enlightened with the Love of God. Christ our God now enters our lives, looking at us; seeing inside us; watching over us, because He loves us, and values us tremendously. He wants each of us to be with Him in His Everlasting Kingdom. +FR. THEODORE

Ο Νικόλαος ο Καβάσιλας, στο κλασικό του βιβλίο, Η εν Χριστώ Ζωή, εξηγεί ότι ο Χριστός είναι η Εικόνα του καθενός μας στο βαθμό που εδημιουργηθήκαμε κατά την Εικόνα και την Ομοίωσήν Του. Σημειώνει: «Πρέπει να θεωρούμε τον Χριστό ως το Αρχέτυπο του πρώην Αδάμ που εδημιουργήθηκε από Αυτόν». (σελ. 191). Η πραότης, η ευσπλαχνία και η δόξα στον Θεό, είναι οι αρετές που περιγράφουν το Πρόσωπο του Χριστού και, κατ' επέκταση, είναι αρετές που μπορούμε να προσωποποιήσουμε στον χαρακτήρα μας, λόγω ότι έχουμεν στη φύση μας πνευματικές δυνάμεις που μας χαρίζει ο Δημιουργός μας. Ο Χριστός ανανεώνει τις πνευματικές δυνάμεις μας: "Ήταν ο Νέος Αδάμ που ήλθε στον κόσμο εξαιτίας της διαφθοράς του παλιού Αδάμ." (Ρωμαίους 8:3, σελ.190).

Το συμείο του Αστέρος της Βηθλεέμ είναι μπροστά μας κατά τη διάρκεια της Θείας Λειτουργίας, ειδικώς, όταν ψάλλουμε το Απολυτίκιον: «Η Γέννησίς Σου, [δηλαδή η γέννησή Σου στον κόσμο] Χριστέ ο Θεός ημών, ανέτειλε τω κόσμω το φως το της γνώσεως εν αυτή γαρ οι τοις άστροις λατρεύοντες, υπό αστέρος εδιδάσκοντο. Σε προσκυνείν, τον Ήλιον της δικαιοσύνης, και Σε γινώσκειν εξ ύψους ανατολήν, Κύριε δόξα Σοι.» Ο αστήρ είναι ένα μέσον διά του οποίου το Άγιο Πνεύμα εφώτισε τον κόσμο, αποκαλύπτοντας ότι ο Χριστός είναι ο μόνος Αληθινός Θεός. Όπως και οι Μάγοι έκαναν τότε, εμείς σήμερα ομολογούμε ότι ο Χριστός είναι Θεός καθώς προσευχόμεθα: «Ανάστασιν Χριστού θεασάμενοι, προσκυνήσουμεν άγιον, Κύριον Ιησούν, τον μόνον ανμάρτητον. Τον Σταυρόν Σου Χριστό προσκυνούμεν και την αγίαν Σου Ανάστασιν υμνούμεν και δοξάζομεν...». Η παρουσία του Αστέρος εις τους ουρανούς μας διδάσκει ότι όλη η ανθρωπότης καλείται να προσκυνήσει τον Χριστόν. Οι Μάγοι και οι βοσκοί αντιπροσωπεύουν ανθρώπους όλων της κάθε καταστάσεως της ζωής. Ο Χριστός είναι Θεός για όλους τους ανθρώπους σε όλες τις εποχές και σε όλους τους τόπους.

Διά μέσου του Αστέρος της Βηθλεέμ, όλοι φωτιζόμεθα με την Αγάπη του Θεού. Ο Χριστός σήμερα εισέρχεται στις ψυχές μας. Μας βλέπει, μας κοιτάζει και μας διαφυλάγει, επιδή μας αγαπά — και, λόγω της τεράστιας αξίας που μας έχει δώσει, θέλει όλους μας να είμεθα μαζί Του στην Αιώνιον Βασιλείαν Του. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

### **Archepiscopal Encyclical on the Feast of Christmas**

December 25, 2023

Unto the Most Reverend and Right Reverend Hierarchs, Pious Priests and Deacons, Monks and Nuns, Presidents and Members of the Parish Councils, Honorable Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, Members of Leadership 100, Day and Afternoon Schools, Philoptochos Societies, Youth, Greek Orthodox Organizations, and entirety of the Christ-loving Plenitude of the Sacred Archdiocese of America:

Thus says the Lord: a rod shall come forth out of the root of Jesse, and a blossom shall rise from that root.

(Prophecy of Isaiah 11:1)

Beloved sisters and brothers in Christ,

Christ is Born! Let us glorify Him!

Although He comes to us in humility, in swaddling clothes and in poverty, He is the powerful Rod of the Root of Jesse. In assuming our human nature from his Most Holy Mother the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary, He bears all the suffering and sin of humanity across all the ages. What strength in this Rod! What glory in His powerful love for every creature!

He also comes as a blossom of inner and truthful beauty, to restore our human nature to its original shining loveliness. The Prophet Isaiah says elsewhere, "He had no beauty nor glory..." (53:2), but such was the humility that bowed down the Son of God to become the Son of Man. The flower of His virtues, His sinless life, His sacrificial love, is a bloom that will never fade. The root of His human nature is his Holy Mother, who bore him in a cave in Bethlehem of Judea. But from this root out of dry and virginal ground, there arose the first fruits of them that slept (I Corinthians 15:20)! For the Lord was born in cave in order to arise from another cave. He was wrapped as an infant in swaddling clothes in order to proclaim His own Resurrection by leaving behind the grave-linens set aside in the tomb (John 20:5). And He was laid in a manger — used to feed the mute beasts of burden — so that we might be fed with His Holy Body and Precious Blood and proclaim Him risen from the dead.

Therefore, my beloved Christians, let us receive this Rod of glory and Blossom of beauty with gratitude and honor. Through his Holy Mother, His human nature is our human nature, and there is nothing that He cannot make whole and pure. Let us worship Him with all our hearts, and minds, and souls.

Christ is Born! Let us glorify Him!


