GOSPEL - St. Matthew 21:33-42

The Lord said this parable, "There was a householder who planted a vineyard, and set a and built a tower, and let it out to tenants, and went into another country. When the season tenants, to get his fruit; and the tenants took his servants and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other servants, more than the first; and they did the same to them. Afterward he sent his son to them, saying 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and have his inheritance.' And they took him and cast him out of the vineyard and killed him. When therefore the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and let out the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the fruits in their seasons." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: 'The very stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner; this was the Lord's doing, and it was marvelous in our eyes?"

With pride they said to the Apostles, 'Death is vanquished. Christ our God is risen, bestowing upon the world His great mercy."/To $\varphi \alpha \iota \delta \rho o v$.

- 2) "Becoming a partner with the Apostles in way of life and successor to their thrones, O God-inspired Saint, in the active life you found an entrance to contemplation. Hence you rightly expounded the word of truth, and you shed your blood in struggling for the faith, O Hieromartyr Anthimos. TENDING THE VINEYARD

Many of our Orthodox Christian saints speak about the "vineyard of our soul," from which spiritual fruits are produced. In today's passage from his First Epistle to the Corinthians, St. Paul mentions "watchfulness over our faith," and being courageous and strong — and doing so with love. In Galatians 5: 22-23, he defines the fruits of the Spirit as being , love, peace, forbearance, kindness, faithfulness, and self-control. Such fruits, coming from within us are to be offered to God and others. In doing this, we find ourselves tending to a larger vineyard — the vineyard of our Lord's Holy Church.

Unfortunately, we live in times when many people consider such fruits of the soul as watchfulness, courage, forbearance, kindness and self-control as *weaknesses*, or simply "out of date." It almost seems normal to live with the fear of violence that erupts due to the ever-so-common feelings of hate, unrest, impatience, rudeness and self-absorption that serve as evidence of "persecuting" Christ our God by casting Him out of the vineyard of our hearts and souls, ignoring His love and mocking His humility. Our Church today is faced with the challenge of inspiring the very idea of repentance to a world in which people rarely even acknowledge that there are any sins anymore, and we ourselves —Orthodox Christians — are also some of those among them.

Let's not keep our Savior "in our corner" just for "good luck." He wants us to follow Him, rather than casting Him out of our vineyard, which means that we love one another as our Lord loves us. As Christ God forgives us, we forgive ourselves and others; as Christ resisted temptation, we fight against temptations, and by doing so, we avoid evil and give glory to God in our every day way of life. +FR. Πολλοί από τους αγίους μας ομιλούν για τον «αμπέλι της ψυχής μας», από τον οποίο προσφέρονται πνευματικοί καρποί. Στην περικοπή εκ της Πρώτης προς Κορινθίους Επιστολής του, ο Άγ. Παύλος αναφέρει την «ενδυνάμωση της πίστεώς μας στον Θεό» και την ανάγκη να είμεθα θαρραλέοι και ισχυροί στην προθυμία μας να κάνουμε καλό — και με αγάπη. Στην Επιστολή του προς τους Γαλάτες 5:22-23, ορίζει τους καρπούς του Πνεύματος -- αγάπη, ειρήνη, υπομονή, καλοσύνη, πίστη και εγκράτεια. Τέτοιοι καρποί, που προέρχονται από μέσα μας, πρέπει να προσφερθούν στον Θεό και σε άλλους. Κάνοντας αυτό, υπηρετούμε επίσης σε έναν μεγαλύτερο αμπελώνα - τον αμπελώνα της του Χριστού Εκκλησίας.

Δυστυχώς, ζούμε σε μια εποχή που πολλοί άνθρωποι θεωρούν τους καρπούς της ψυχής όπως η εγρήγορση, το θάρρος, η υπομονή, η καλοσύνη και η εγκράτεια ως αδυναμίες, νομίζοντας ότι η πνευματική ζωή είναι απλώς «ασυγχρόνιστη». Φαίνεται σχεδόν φυσιολογικό για τον άνθρωπο να ζει με τον φόβο της βίας που ξεσπά λόγω των ολοένα και τόσο κοινών συναισθημάτων μίσους, αναταραχής, ανυπομονησίας, αγένειας και τον γενικό εγωισμό, που αποτελούν απόδειξη ότι «διώκουμε» τον Χριστό διώχνοντάς Τον έξω από τον αμπελώνα των ψυχών μας, αγνοώντας την αγάπη Του και την ταπεινο-Συνέγεια στην επόμενη σελίδα – – – >

φροσύνη Του. Η Εκκλησία μας σήμερα παλεύει να εμπνεύσει τον κόσμο σχετικά με την ίδια την ιδέα της μετάνοιας σε έναν κόσμο στον οποίο οι άνθρωποι σπανίως παραδέχονται οτι υπάρχει αυτό που λέγεται *αμαρτία*, και εμείς οι ίδιοι —Ελληνορθόδοξοι — είμεθα επίσης μερικοί από αυτούς.

Ας μην έχουμε τον Χριστό στη διάθεσή μας μόνο για «καλή τύχη». Θέλει να Τον ακολουθήσουμε, αντί να Τον διώξουμε από τον αμπελώνα μας, που σημαίνει ότι πρέπει να αγαπάμε ο ένας τον άλλον όπως μας αγαπά ο Χριστός. Όπως μας συγχωρεί ο Χριστός, πρέπει να συγχωρούμε τον εαυτό μας και τους άλλους. Καθώς ο Χριστός αντιστάθηκε στον πειρασμό, πρέπει επίσης να πολεμήσουμε ενάντια στους πειρασμούς -- και με αυτόν τον τρόπο αποφεύγουμε το κακό και προσφέρουμε δόξα στον Θεό μέσω του καθημερινού μας τρόπου ζωής. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

Much planning from our volunteer teachers goes into preparing to assure each student has proper books, lesssons, activity supplies and even the amount of food when lunch is provided.

OUTREACH PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES -We've added another Sunday each month, that will vary, so we can actively participate, grow, experience and discover ways to use our talents and passions to help disciple others in God's faith, hope and love for all. We've been participating with our St George Philoptochos in their many community initiatives, on a local and national level. Last year we packaged many Hygiene kits, wrote personalized cards for each bag with messages of God's love and our prayers for them; folded over 400 pairs of socks and helped at THE NARROW DOOR to sort and package donated food items that is distributed to those families in need in the Coachella Valley.

FAMILY WORSHIP SUNDAY – Other Sundays of the month where classes are not held. 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
