PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE -Galatians 6:11-18

Brethren, see with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that would compel you to be circumcised, and only in order that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. For even those who receive circumcision do not themselves keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may glory in your flesh. But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. Peace and mercy be upon all who walk by this rule, upon the Israel of God. Henceforth let no man trouble

me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

GOSPEL- St. John. 3:13-17

The Lord said, "No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

THE NATIVITY OF THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD - Sts. Joachim and Anna, were childless for many years. Yet, they remained faithful to God, and prayed fervently for God to bless them with a child. As they prayed, Anna promised to offer her child as a gift to the Lord. In answer to their prayer, Anna gave birth to a daughter, Mary. The Liturgical celebration of this event, which was observed on September 8th, ends with today's Divine Liturgy.

THE SUNDAY BEFORE THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS - At the same time, with today's Divine Liturgy, we prepare our souls to embrace the Holy Cross of our Lord, which was recovered by St. Constantine's mother, St. Helen, and restored to the Church, being raised up high so that the faithful could venerate It. As they venerated the Cross, they chanted *"Lord, have mercy"* repeatedly. On September 14th, this event is commemorated as the *"*Exaltation of the Holy Cross." +FR. THEODORE

Liturgical Notes for Today

At the Entrance of the Gospel: 1) "O Faithful, let us sing a hymn of praise and worship to the Logos Who is co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, Who was born of the Virgin for our salvation. Of His own Will, He went upon the Cross in the flesh and suffered death, to raise the dead through His glorious Resurrection."/Tov Συνάναρχον Λογον...

2) "Your birth, O Theotokos, brought joy to the whole world, for from You dawned the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God. Freeing us from the curse, He gave us His blessings. Abolishing death, He granted us eternal life."/Η Γέννησις Σου...

3) "Since You are a deliverer of captives..."/Ως των αιχμαλώτων ελευθεροτής...[Hymn for St. George]

4) **Kontakion:** "In Your holy birth, Immaculate One, Joachim and Anna were rid of the shame of childlessness; Adam and Eve of corruption and death. And so Your people, free of guilt of their sins, celebrate crying: 'The barren one gives birth to the Theotokos, Who nourishes our life.'"/Ιωακείμ και Αννα ονειδισμού...

THE LARGE LETTERS OF THE BIBLE

The Israelites in St. Paul's time observed the religious practice of circumcision as only a formality. However, St. Paul used "large letters" in writing to the Galatians in order to emphasize that, with Christ, the things we do and say are no longer matters of formality, but they have eternal implications, since, in Christ, our personalities gradually transform into living expressions of Divine Love – we become a new creation.

In anything we do, whether it is repentance, worship, or work, it doesn't count if it is done with the motive of making sure we only follow the formalities, devoid of meaning and purpose. Repentance does not exist so that others can be impressed with our remorse for something gone wrong, but which (as is so common today) is "not really our fault." The Divine Liturgy, the central point of our worship as Orthodox Christians, does not exist so that people can be impressed with the priest, deacon, hierarch, chanters, or choir, as if it's a theater performance. Repentance and worship are given to us by our Savior so that we can unite ourselves with His love, finding peace in our hearts and strength to offer meaningful care for others in Christ's Name.

In today's Gospel passage we heard that God gave His Only-Begotten Son not so that we can be judged, but so that we can be saved. The only judgment that we face from our Savior is that which validates our own decision as to whether or not we want to be saved. If we do not want to repent of any-thing at all, or offer sincere humble worship to Christ, the question remains as to whether we want to be saved, or to just "go through the motions" for some other reasons, as in the case of the Israelites of St. Paul's time.

Οι Ισραηλίτες κατά την εποχή του Αγίου Παύλου τηρούσαν τη θρησκευτική τάξη της περιτομής ως απλώς μια τυπική διαδικασία. Ωστόσο, ο Άγιος Παύλος χρησιμοποίησε «μεγάλα γράμματα» καθώς έγραψε στους Γαλάτες για να τονίσει οτι αυτά που κάνουμε και λέμε δεν είναι πλέον τυπικά, αλλά έχουν αιώνια σημασία λόγω του γεγονότος ότι, εν Χριστώ, οι προσωπικότητές μας μεταβάλλονται σταδιακά σε ζωντανές εκφράσεις της Θείας Αγάπης ώστε να είμεθα μιά νέα δημιουργία.

Σε οτιδήποτε κάνουμε, είτε είναι μετάνοια, λατρεία, ή εργασία, δεν μετράει αν γίνεται με το κίνητρο να βεβαιωθούμε ότι ακολουθούμε μόνο τις τυπικές διαδικασίες, όμως χωρίς θεϊκό νόημα και σκοπό. Η μετάνοια δεν υπάρχει για να εντυπωσιασθούν οι άλλοι με τις τύψεις μας για κάτι που επήγε στραβά, αλλά που (όπως συνηθίζεται σήμερα) «δεν είναι πραγματικά δικό μας λάθος». Η Θεία Λειτουργία, η κενδρική ακολουθία της λατρείας των Ορθοδόξων Χριστιανών, δεν υπάρχει για να εντυπωσιασθούν όλοι με τον ιερέα, τον διάκονο, τον ιεράρχη, τους ψάλτες ή τη χορωδία, σαν πως κάνουμε θέατρο. Η Συνέχεια στην επόμενη σελίδα – – – >

μετάνοια και η λατρεία δίνονται από τον Σωτήρα μας για να μπορούμε να ενωθούμε με την αγάπη Του, ευρίσκοντας ειρήνη στις καρδιές μας και δύναμη για να προσφέρουμε ουσιαστική βοήθεια και υποστήριξη προς σωτηρίαν των άλλων εις το Όνομα του Χριστού.

Στη σημερινή περικοπή του Ευαγγελίου ακούσαμε ότι ο Θεός απέστειλε τον Μονογενή Του Υιό όχι για να κριθούμε, αλλά για να σωθούμε. Η μόνη κρίση που αντιμετωπίζουμε από τον Σωτήρα μας είναι αυτή που επικυρώνει τη δική μας απόφαση περί του εάν θέλουμε ή όχι να σωθούμε. Αν δεν θέλουμε να μετανοήσουμε καθόλου ή να προσφέρουμε ειλικρινή και ταπεινή λατρεία στον Χριστό, το ερώτημα παραμένει αν θέλουμε να σωθούμε, ή απλώς να τηρήσουμε τυπικότητες για επίδειξη, όπως στην περίπτωση των Ισραηλιτών κατά την εποχή του Αγίου Παύλου. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ





how God sent His Son Jesus to us.

We wear crosses around our necks.






We kiss the Cross.

We bow down before the Cross and we sing a special song about the Cross:


> Before Thy cross, we bow down in worship O Master, And Thy Holy Resurrection we glorify.
