PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE - Hebrews 6:13-20

Brethren, when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore to himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently endured, obtained the promise. Men indeed swear by a greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the prom ise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he interposed with an oath, so that through two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible that God should prove false, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to seize the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.

GOSPEL - St. Mark 9:17-31

At that time, a man came to Jesus kneeling and saying: "Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a dumb spirit; and wherever it seizes him it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able." And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you?

How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him; and when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has he had this?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you can do anything, have pity on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible to him who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You dumb and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse; so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he would not have any one know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; and when he is killed, after three days he will rise."

Liturgical Notes for Today

With the Entrance with the Gospel: 1) "The women disciples of the Lord heard from the angel the joyful news of the Resurrection and the repeal of the sentence imposed upon our forefathers. With pride, they said to the Apostles, 'Death is vanquished; Christ our God is risen, bestowing upon the world His great mercy.'"/ Το φαιδρόν της αναστάσεως...

2) "With the rivers of your tears you made the barren desert bloom; and with your sighs from deep within, you made your labors bear their fruits a hundredfold; and you became a star, illuminating the world by your miracles, O John, our devout father. Intercede with Christ our God, for the salvation of our souls."/ Ταις των δακρύων σου ροαίς...[Hymn for St. John of the Ladder]

3) "Since You are a deliverer of captives and a protector of the poor; a physician for the sick; a noble attendant to kings, O Great among the martyrs and glorious George, intercede with Christ God that He may save our souls."/ Ω ς των αιχμαλώτων ελευθερωτής...[Hymn for St. George]

4) **Kontakion:** "To You, Theotokos, invincible Defender, having been delivered from peril, I, Your city, dedicate the victory festival as a thank offering. In Your irresistible might, keep me safe from all trials, that I may call out to You: 'Hail, Unwedded Bride.'"/Τη Υπερμάχω...

ST. JOHN OF THE LADDER

St. John was Abbot of the Monastery at Mount Sinai. He is celebrated today because his book, *The Ladder of Divine Ascent*, is a guide to our spiritual life on our journey through Great Lent. It teaches those seeking salvation how to lay a sound foundation for their struggles, how to detect and war against each of the passions and how to avoid the snares laid by the demons who harass us with many deceptions and temptations. Such instruction is a gift for which we must be *grateful*.

Given the fabric of our modern society, we are each faced with a critical spiritual question: Are we to feel *entitled* to receiving blessings, or are we to be *grateful* for receiving blessings? Our way of life and our attitude toward life depends on how we answer such a question.

Orthodox Christian Saints, like St. John of the Ladder, whom we commemorate today, were always grateful to our Lord and Savior for everything and offered prayers of thanksgiving to Him. Being grateful inspires us to pray... and prayer strengthens our faith -- and faith helps us to give of ourselves for the salvation of others. Such is that which we call "living prayer." In St. Basil's Liturgy we find these words, giving us our reason for living in gratitude: "...We give thanks to You...[You are] the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the great God and Savior, the Object of our hope...[For] through Him the Holy Spirit was made manifest, the Spirit of Truth, the gift of adoption, the foretaste of the future inheritance..." +FR. 
